K-9 UNIT

In October 2004, Officer Daniel J. Hansen was sent to Southern Police Canine School in North Carolina for 6 weeks to begin the bonding and training process with the new Brown Deer Police K-9, a Dutch Shepard imported from Holland named Justis. Justis is the department's fifth K-9.

Officer Hansen and K-9 Justis are trained in Narcotics Detection, Criminal Apprehension, Officer Protection, Evidence Retrieval and Tracking.

K-9 Justis lives year round with Officer Hansen at his residence and rides to and from work with Officer Hansen. Justis is strictly a police working dog. Because K-9 Justis has unique duties very different from a pet dog, he is not allowed to play with common dog toys, eat any human food or be in the police station. K-9 Justis is rewarded when he locates the odor of a narcotic and the human scent of a fleeing or hidden suspect.

K-9 ACTIVITY FOR THE YEAR 2004:

Officer Hansen and K-9 Justis began official duty together on November 24, 2004. The following is a summary of initiated patrol activity and calls for service from November and December 2004:
