The meeting was called to order by President Krueger at 6:30 P.M.

IV. Consideration of Minutes: April 7, 2014 - Regular Meeting

It was moved by Trustee Boschert and seconded by Trustee Oates to approve the minutes from the April 7, 2014 - Regular Meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

V. Unfinished Business

VI. New Business

A) Resolution No. 14-12, "Resolution for the Brown Deer Varsity Cheer Team"

President Krueger read the resolution recognizing the Cheer Team's significant accomplishments of winning two Division III state championships in the All-Girl Stunt Category and Co-Ed Small Category. He continued to give congratulations to coaches Heidel Dallman and Rose Trapp. Ms. Dallman said a few words about the teams' competitions.

It was moved by Trustee Springman and seconded by Trustee Boschert to adopt Resolution No. 14-12, "Resolution for the Brown Deer Varsity Cheer Team". The motion carried unanimously.

B) Resolution No. 14-11, "Resolution for the Brown Deer Citizen of the Year – Ann Griffin"

President Krueger read the resolution recognizing Ann Griffin as this year's Brown Deer Citizen of the Year.

It was moved by Trustee Springman and seconded by Trustee Awe to adopt Resolution No. 14-11, "Resolution for the Brown Deer Citizen of the Year - Ann Griffin". The motion carried unanimously.

C) Liquor License – Change of Ownership – Poco Loco, 4134 West River Lane

Ms. Kenda-Lubetski reviewed her memorandum and stated the Village has received notification that there has been a change in ownership at Poco Loco Cantina from Jacob Dean Enterprises, LLC to 4134 LLC. The officers for Jacob Dean Enterprises, LLC are requesting the transfer of the "Class B" Intoxicating Liquor License and "Class B" Beer License currently held by Jacob Dean Enterprises, LLC, d/b/a Poco Loco Cantina, located at 4134 West River Lane to 4134, LLC. Stacy Lynn Kessler is currently serving as

the Agent for Jacob Dean Enterprises, LLC. Ms. Kessler is being recommended as the appointed agent for 4134 LLC. A total of \$630.00 was paid to the Village for the transfer from Jacob Dean Enterprises, LLC to 4134 LLC to complete the transfer of the liquor license.

It was moved by Trustee Boschert and seconded by Trustee Oates to approve the transfer of the “Class B” Intoxicating Liquor and Intoxicating Beer License held by Jacob Dean Enterprises, LLC to 4134 LLC to operate Poco Loco Cantina located at 4134 West River Lane. The motion carried unanimously.

D) License Applications for “Eat & Greet on the Street” Event

Mr. Janecke announced the request before the Board is to make Dean Gardner the lead person of coordinating the purchase of beer and wines for selling at the block party taking place in Original Village. Each establishment within the Original Village area that currently holds a valid liquor license will also be selling alcoholic beverages at their place of business. Mrs. Kenda-Lubetski added this is a one-time only exception on June 7th. The liquor license application that was submitted for 4134, LLC states “Outside Block Party” in the Premises Description of where alcohol beverages are going to be sold and stored. Attorney Fuchs commented on the difficulty of obtaining a legal liquor license for the event without having to amend every license of each of the businesses in the area who would like participate in the sale of alcohol.

President Krueger inquired into the details of the layout of the event. Mr. Piotrowski and Mr. Hall addressed the use of Public Works for setup and take down and also parking. Attorney Fuchs further opined on the use of the Village’s mutual insurance company to cover any liability the Village would have for the event. A brief conversation took place regarding extra event liability insurance.

Trustee Oates inquired how people purchasing alcohol at the local businesses will be informed they cannot bring the alcoholic drinks to the venue from the business. Staff reported they will be informed by the establishment owner, signs and other literature, along with police presence.

Trustee Springman asked that the Recycling Center be closed that day.

It was moved by President Krueger and seconded by Trustee Boschert to approve the extension of the boundaries of the “Class B” Intoxicating Liquor and Intoxicating Beer License held by 4134, LLC, operating as Poco Loco Cantina, located at 4134 West River Land on June 7, 2014 from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. The motion carried unanimously.

E) Review of N. 60th Street Plat from W. Cloverleaf to W. County Line Road

Mr. Piotrowski reviewed his memorandum and mentioned The Village’s consultant GAI has prepared a plat document that highlights the necessary right of way acquisition along 60th Street to adequately accommodate all roadway improvements that are designed for the street’s reconstruction from County Line to Fairy Chasm. The roadway reconstruction is scheduled to take place in 2015 and is to be financed with a combination of Village funds and State of Wisconsin funding. The negotiation and ultimate acquisition will be handled by the Village’s consultant and will follow State of Wisconsin mandated acquisition procedures. The land to be acquired does not contain any private improvements and is generally no more than 35 feet in width. This plat is the necessary first step in allowing the Village to begin negotiations.

Trustee Springman asked how the individuals will be contacted. Mr. Piotrowski replied the Village’s consult will more than likely use Village letterhead and a Staff person’s signature.

Trustee Oates asked about the consultants experience with acquiring property for right of way purposes. Mr. Piotrowski responded GAI has subcontracted with Heritage, who specializes in these types of acquisitions.

It was moved by Trustee Springman and seconded by Trustee Baker to approve the change to the N. 60th Street Plat from W. Cloverleaf to W. County Line Road. The motion carried unanimously.

F) Conditional Use Permit with Metro Storage LLC for a Self-Storage Warehouse 4059 W. Bradley Road

Mr. Moreno reviewed his memorandum and added Metro Storage LLC proposes the development of a self-storage facility at 4059 West Bradley Road. This site lies within a “B-3” commercial zoning district. Village zoning codes for this type of zoning district state that use of the land and its structures for storage purposes is contingent upon approval of a conditional use permit. This land once housed offices and distribution facilities for Beloit Beverage Company. The proposal solicits redevelopment of an existing two-story administration building and an adjoining warehouse. The three new buildings will be ambient storage structures. A sidewalk will be extended along the northern side of the property. Mr. Moreno introduced Bob Hailman, representative from Metro Storage, who will answer any questions the Board may have. Mr. Hailman continued to present the building and site designs.

Trustee Boschert asked Mr. Hailman if he owns or operates any other storage facilities like this. Mr. Hailman responded that Metro Storage is a family owned business with a total of 85 storage facilities mostly in northern Indiana and Illinois.

Trustee Boschert asked if a security company will be onsite. Mr. Hailman responded there will not; however, a security camera system will be installed and can be viewed offsite.

It was moved by Trustee Oates and seconded by Trustee Boschert to approve the Conditional Use Permit wit Metro Storage LLC for a Self-Storage Warehouse 4059 W. Bradley Road. The motion carried unanimously.

G) Policy on Use of Village Sign

Mr. Hall reviewed the sign policy and stated the intentions of the policy are to ensure the use of the sign for the advertising of Village events and information and any other programs that benefit/pertain to the Village or where the Village Manager sees fit.

It was moved by President Krueger and seconded by Trustee Springman to adopt the Policy on Use of Village Sign. The motion carried unanimously.

H) 2014 Street Rehabilitation Project – Payne & Dolan, Inc.

Mr. Maederer stated sealed bids for the 2014 Street Reconstruction Program were received and opened on March 26, 2014. As in the past several years, two bids were received. Both Payne & Dolan and Stark Asphalt remain extremely competitive when bidding for work in Brown Deer. Payne & Dolan has done the vast majority of municipal paving for the Village in the last 30 years. They also remain strong in the private sector, and have paved a substantial amount of commercial projects as well. Since the bids came in well under budget, Staff requests that a portion of the balance be used to pave an additional street, in order to take advantage of the asphalt prices.

It was moved by Trustee Oates and seconded by Trustee Springman to award the contract for the 2014 Street Rehabilitation Project to Payne & Dolan, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$280,805.00. The motion carried unanimously.

I) West County Line Road Reconstruction – Payne & Dolan, Inc.

Mr. Maederer announced the City of Mequon and Village of Brown Deer share jurisdiction of County Line Road and therefore will share in the cost of the needed improvements. County Line Road from 67th Street to the railroad tracks east of 52nd Street/Garden Drive is rated as “poor”. The City of Mequon has taken the initiative to be the lead agency for the construction oversight and oversight efforts. The City of Mequon will provide full-time construction inspection services for the project. Sealed bids for the project were received by the City of Mequon on Wednesday, April 2nd. The low bidder for the work is Payne & Dolan and they are also contractor for the Village’s annual road re-paving program. Generally the project will be split 50/50 with the City of Mequon; however, the Village is participating 100% for the construction costs associated with the new sidewalk.

President Krueger clarified all of the fire hydrants are on Brown Deer’s side of the road. Mr. Maederer confirmed.

Trustee Baker asked what the City of Milwaukee’s intentions are to replace the portion of County Line Road west of the Village. Mr. Maederer responded that was planned for reconstruction this year, however, that project has been pushed back until 2015.

It was moved by Trustee Oates and seconded by Trustee Boschert to award the contract for the West County Line Road Reconstruction to Payne & Dolan, Inc. The motion carried unanimously.

J) West County Line Road Reconstruction – Construction Memorandum of Understanding Boulevard)

Mr. Maederer reviewed the Memorandum of Understanding and offering an explanation that the memo addressed the roles, responsibilities, and financial obligations for the design services associates with the road reconstruction project on County Line Road from 68th Street to the railroad tracks. The City of Mequon passed the agreement last week.

It was moved by Trustee Oates and seconded by Trustee Boschert to approve the Memorandum of Understanding Cost Share Agreement for County Line Road Reconstruction with the City of Mequon/Village of Brown Deer Multi-Jurisdictional Project. The motion carried unanimously.

K) New Vehicles for DPW and Community Services

Mr. Hall announced the CIP budget for 2014 and 2015 call for the replacement of three vehicles. One vehicle is scheduled for the 2014 year in the DPW department. The vehicle to be replaced is a 1998 GMC Sierra pickup truck. This vehicle is used by the DPW director. Originally the other two vehicles were scheduled for the 2015 CIP budget but a recent maintenance issue has made one of the vehicles unusable. The other vehicle is also having maintenance issues making it necessary to push this CIP project to 2014. The two vehicles are 2001 Ford Taurus’s used by the Community Development Department. One vehicle is used by the building inspector and the other is used by the Zoning and Planning Specialist. Each department has requested the replacement vehicle to be a 2014 Ford Escape.

President Krueger asked if the Escape will be replacing the old brown truck being used in the Public Works Department. Mr. Maederer commented the Escape will not necessarily be used for work but to travel to and from different job sites. Trustee Baker asked whether or not the new vehicles will be all-wheel drive or front wheel drive. Mr. Hall confirmed they will be front wheel drive.

It was moved by Trustee Oates and seconded by Trustee Awe to approve the purchase of three 2014 Ford Escape vehicles with floor mats for the Department of Public Works and Community Services in an amount not to exceed \$53,601. The motion carried unanimously.

L) February 2014 Financial Reports

Ms. Hudson reported the Village has collected approximately 72% of the tax levy, received 48% of its revenues and has spent approximately 16% of the budgeted expenditures.

M) Consideration of March 2014 Vouchers

It was moved by Trustee Oates and seconded by Trustee Boschert to approve the vouchers from February 28, 2014 to March 27, 2014 in the amount of \$1,594,175.73. The motion carried unanimously.

N) Presentation by the North Shore Health Department

Mrs. Kinzel made a presentation regarding the North Shore Health Department. Her presentation touched on the many services they provide, organizational makeup, how funding is provided, the unique situations they face, and the challenges she see the Health Department facing in the future. Trustee Baker thanked Mrs. Kinzel on the format she used for her presentation



| EXPLANATION: | <p>The Village has received a request from Janet Kassens, owner and proprietor of Prime Time Sports Bar & Eatery, located in the Original Village at 8777 North Deerwood Drive. She is requesting that the Premises Description of her current "Class B" Intoxicating Liquor and Intoxicating Beer License be amended to include an outdoor patio.</p> <p>As you know, the Original Village went through a major redevelopment of the area in 2013. The construction included the addition of an outdoor patio area, located on the north end of her property. Ms. Kassens has included a letter requesting the change and has also paid a \$10.00 fee to change her license to include the outdoor patio, if approved by the Village Board.</p> <p>Ms. Kassens would like to start serving alcohol and food on the outdoor patio as soon as possible. Additional landscaping has been added to encircle the patio and Ms. Kassens proposes a post and chain setup to cordon off the areas adjacent to the building that is now "hardscaped" with concrete or brick pavers. The Police Department has not yet determined whether the new landscaping and proposed post and chain arrangement will be sufficient to define and separate the space for license enforcement purposes. The Police Department will be present at the meeting to brief the Board as to its determination.</p> <p>Pursuant to State Statutes and the Village Code, all changes that pertain to intoxicating liquor licenses must be presented for consideration and approved by the Village Board.</p> |



An Ordinance Creating
Volume I, Chapter V, Article 18
"Parades and Public Assembly Regulations"
of the Village of Brown Deer Village Code

ORDINANCE NO. 99-10

WHEREAS, the Village of Brown Deer Traffic and Public Safety Committee considered options and samples as they relate to Parades and Public Assembly ordinances and has recommended creation of such an ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF BROWN DEER DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. That Article 18, Chapter V, Volume I of the Village of Brown Deer Village Code be created to read as follows:

Article 18, Parades and Public Assembly Regulations

SECTION 5-18.01 Purpose: Definitions.

- (a) **Purpose.** The Village of Brown Deer recognizes that Village streets and highways are primarily for the use of vehicular travel. It further recognizes a need to use these public streets and highways for processions, parades, runs, walks, bicycle races, marathons, etc., which do not substantially interfere with the public's right to travel on such streets and highways. This Chapter is intended to regulate and control non-vehicular use of the streets and highways and for protecting the general welfare and safety of the persons using the streets and highways within the Village. Said authority to regulate is contained in Section 349.185, Wisconsin Statutes, and related sections.
- (b) **Definitions.** As used in this Chapter:
- (1) **PARADE** means any march, demonstration, procession or motorcade consisting of persons, animals, or vehicles or a combination thereof upon the streets, parks or other public grounds within the Village with an intent of attracting public attention that interferes with the normal flow or regulation of traffic upon the streets, parks or other public grounds.
 - (2) **PARADE OR PUBLIC ASSEMBLY PERMIT** means a permit as required by this Ordinance.
 - (3) **PERSON** means any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company or organization of any kind.

- (4) **PUBLIC ASSEMBLY** means any meeting, demonstration, picket line, rally or gathering of more than twenty-five (25) persons for a common purpose as a result of prior planning that interferes with the normal flow or regulation of pedestrian or vehicular traffic or occupies any public area in a place open to the general public.
- (5) **SIDEWALK** is any area or way set aside or open to the general public for purposes of pedestrian traffic, whether or not it is paved.
- (6) **STREET** is any place or way set aside or open to the general public for purposes of vehicular traffic, including any berm or shoulder parkway, right-of-way, or median strip thereof.

SECTION 5-18.02 Permit Requirements.

- (a) **Permit required.** No person shall engage in or conduct any parade or public assembly unless a permit has been obtained in advance as provided in this Chapter.
- (b) **Exemptions from permit requirement.** A permit is not required for assembling or movement of a funeral procession or military convoy. Any parade, etc., sponsored by any agency of the federal or state government, acting in its governmental capacity within the scope of its authority, shall be required to obtain a permit, however, shall be exempt from the parade permit fee and insurance requirements contained herein.
- (c) **When application must be made.** A person seeking a parade or public assembly permit shall file an application with the Chief of Police on a form provided by the Village no less than thirty (30) days prior to the usage.
- (d) **Information required in application.** The application for a parade or public assembly permit shall set forth the following information:
 - (1) The name, address and telephone number of the applicant.
 - (2) The names, addresses and telephone number of the headquarters of the organization the usage is proposed to be conducted for, if any, and the authorized and responsible heads of such organization.
 - (3) The requested date when the usage is to be conducted.
 - (4) The route to be traveled, including the starting point and the termination point.
 - (5) The approximate number of persons who, and animals and vehicles which will constitute such parade or public assembly and the type of animals and description of the vehicles.
 - (6) The hours when such usage will start and terminate.
 - (7) A statement as to whether the parade or public assembly will occupy all or only a portion of the width of the streets proposed to be traversed.
 - (8) The location by street of any assembly areas for such parade or public assembly.
 - (9) The time at which units of the parade or public assembly will begin to assemble at any such area.

- (10) The intervals of space to be maintained between units of such parade or public assembly.
- (11) If the parade or public assembly is designed to be held by, or on behalf of, any person other than the applicant, the applicant for such permit shall file a letter from that person with the Chief of Police authorizing the applicant to apply for the permit on his behalf.
- (12) The type of public assembly, including a description of activities planned during the event.
- (13) A description of any recording equipment, sound amplification equipment, banners, signs, or other attention-getting devices to be used in connection with the parade or public assembly.
- (14) The approximate number of participants (spectators are not defined as participants).
- (15) The approximate number of spectators.
- (16) A designation of any public facilities or equipment to be utilized.
- (17) Any additional information that the Chief of Police finds reasonably necessary to a fair determination as to whether a permit should be issued.

(e) **Standards for Issuance.** The Chief of Police shall issue a permit as provided herein when, from a consideration of the application and from such other information as may be obtained, he finds that:

- (1) The conduct of the parade or public assembly will not substantially interrupt the safe and orderly movement of other traffic contiguous to its route or location.
- (2) The conduct of the parade or public assembly will not substantially interrupt the safe and orderly movement of other pedestrian or vehicular traffic contiguous to its route or location.
- (3) The concentration of persons, animals, and vehicles at public assembly points of the parade or public assembly will not unduly interfere with proper fire and police protection of, or ambulance service to, areas contiguous to such public assembly areas.
- (4) The conduct of the parade or public assembly is not reasonably likely to cause injury to persons or property.
- (5) The parade or public assembly is scheduled to move from its point of origin to its point of termination expeditiously and without unreasonable delays en route.
- (6) Adequate sanitation and other required health facilities are or will be made available in or adjacent to any public assembly areas.
- (7) There are sufficient parking places near the site of the parade or public assembly to accommodate the number of vehicles reasonably expected.
- (8) The applicant has secured the police protection, if any, required under Section 5-18.02(j).
- (9) Such parade or public assembly is not for the primary purpose of advertising any product, goods or event that is primarily for private profit, and the parade itself is not primarily for profit. The prohibition against advertising any product, goods or event shall not apply to signs identifying organizations or sponsors furnishing or sponsoring exhibits or structures used in the parade.

- (10) No parade or public assembly permit application for the same time and location is already granted or has been received and will be granted.
- (11) No parade or public assembly permit application for the same time and location is already granted or has been received and will be granted, and the police resources required for that prior parade or public assembly are so great that in combination with the subsequent proposed application, the resulting deployment of police services would have any immediate and adverse effect upon the welfare and safety of persons and property.
- (12) No event is scheduled elsewhere in the City where the police resources required for that event are so great that the deployment of police services for the proposed parade or public assembly would have an immediate and adverse effect upon the welfare and safety of persons and property.

(f) Notice of denial of application.

The Chief of Police shall act upon the application for a parade permit within ten working days after the filing thereof. If the application is not approved, the Chief of Police shall mail to the applicant, within five days after the date upon which the application was filed, a notice of the action, stating the reasons for the denial of the permit.

(g) Appeal Procedure.

Any person aggrieved shall have the right to appeal the denial of a parade permit to the Village Manager. The appeal shall be taken within 10 days after notice. The Village Manager shall act upon the appeal within a reasonable time thereafter.

(h) Alternative Permit.

- (1) The Chief of Police, in denying an application for a parade or public assembly permit, may authorize the conduct of the parade or public assembly at a date, time, location, or route different from that named by the applicant. An applicant desiring to accept an alternate permit shall, within five (5) days after notice of the action of the Chief of Police, file a written notice of acceptance with the Chief of Police.
- (2) An alternate parade or public assembly permit shall conform to the requirements or, and shall have the effect of, a parade or public assembly permit issued under this Ordinance.

(i) Fee. There shall be no fees for permits/applications under this Chapter.

(10) Charge for increased costs.

- (1) The Chief of Police shall determine whether and to what extent additional police protection is reasonably necessary for the parade or public assembly for traffic control and public safety. The Superintendent of Public Works shall determine if municipal services are necessary for the parade or public assembly. Both, the Chief of Police and the Superintendent of Public Works shall base their decisions on the

size, location, duration, time and date of the event, the expected sale or service of alcoholic beverages, the number of streets and intersections blocked, and the need to detour or preempt citizen travel and use of the streets and sidewalks. The speech content of the event shall not be a factor in determining the amount of police protection necessary. If possible, without disruption of ordinary police services or compromise of public safety, regularly scheduled on-duty personnel will police the event. If additional municipal services for the public assembly are deemed necessary by either the Chief of Police or the Superintendent of Public Works, they shall so inform the applicant for the permit. The applicant then shall have the duty to secure the police protection and/or municipal services at the sole expense of the applicant.

- (2) Persons engaging in parades or public assemblies conducted for the sole purpose of public issue speech protected under the First Amendment are not required to pay for any police protection provided by the Village.
- (11) **Emergency revocation.** The Village President, Village Manager, or Chief of Police may revoke a permit already issued if the official deems that such action is justified by actual or potential emergency due to weather, fire, riot, other catastrophe or likelihood of a breach of the peace, or by a major change in the conditions forming the basis of the standards of issuance. In lieu of revoking a permit, an above-named official may require the permittee to file evidence of good and sufficient sureties, insurance in force or other evidence of adequate financial responsibility, running to the Village of Brown Deer and such third parties as may be injured or damaged, in an amount depending upon the likelihood of injury or damage as a direct and proximate result of the holding of the usage sufficient to indemnify the municipality and such third parties as may be injured or damaged thereby, caused by the permittee, its agents or participants.
- (12) **Contents of Permit.**

Each parade permit shall state the following information:

 - (1) Starting time.
 - (2) Speed of travel.
 - (3) Maximum interval of space to be maintained between units of parade.
 - (4) The portions of the streets to be traversed that may be occupied by the parade.
 - (5) The maximum length of the parade.
 - (6) Such other information as the Chief of Police shall find necessary to the enforcement of this ordinance.
- (13) **Notice of Issued Permit.** Immediately upon the issuance of a usage permit, the Chief of Police shall send a copy thereof to the following:
 - (1) Each public transportation utility whose regular service will be affected by the usage.
 - (2) Village Manager, Superintendent of Public Works, and Village President.
- (14) **Public Conduct During Parades.**

- (1) Interference. No person shall unreasonably hamper, obstruct, or impede, or interfere with any parade or parade assembly, or with any person or vehicle participating or used in a parade.
- (2) Driving through parades. No driver or a vehicle shall drive between the vehicles or persons comprising a parade when such vehicles or persons are in motion and are conspicuously designated as a parade.
- (3) Parking on parade route. The Chief of Police shall have the authority when reasonably necessary, to prohibit or restrict the parking of vehicles along a highway or part thereof constituting a part of the route of a parade. Signs shall be posted to such effect, and it shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave unattended any vehicle in violation thereof. No person shall be liable for parking on a street unposted in violation of this ordinance.

SECTION 5-18.03 Penalties.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, nor more than one thousand-five hundred (\$1500.00) dollars, or in default of payment, be imprisoned in the County Jail or House of Correction of Milwaukee County for not more than ninety (90) days. Each violation of any provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense, and every day a violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION II. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effective after its passage and publication according to law.
