

BROWN DEER TRAFFIC AND PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE  
AUGUST 6, 2015 MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Trustee Boschert at 5:30 PM.

I. ROLL CALL

II. PERSONS DESIRING TO BE HEARD

Sharon Floryance and Christine Sowinski were in attendance to speak during the “New Business” section.

III. CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES: May 7, 2015

*It was moved by Trustee Awe, and seconded by Mr. Wazniak to approve the May 7, 2015 meeting minutes. The motion carried unanimously.*

IV. REPORT OF STAFF/COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Chief Kass reported on behalf of Department of Public Works Superintendent Matthew Maederer that August 17<sup>th</sup> is the scheduled wrap up date for Bradley Road project. He further reported that it was business as normal in the police department.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. Review of Parking West Dean Road – North 55<sup>th</sup> Street to North 60<sup>th</sup> Street

Chief Kass reported that angle parking on Dean Road was requested by the School District and they were advised it was not possible. School personnel will continue to park in their designated areas and will have to walk to the appropriate schools. It was the consensus of the Traffic and Public Safety Committee that this issue has been reviewed to the fullest by them and it will not be reviewed further unless requested.

B. Review of Parking – 8500 Block North 42<sup>nd</sup> Street

Trustee Boschert reported the signage has not been installed as of today’s date but he opined that the issue had self-policed itself. The delay has been caused by the purchase of the special poles.

C. Traffic Concerns – North Carlotta Lane and West Glenbrook Road

Chief Kass reported that another request was received for a stop sign on North Carlotta Lane. He reported the information that has been collected in the past by the Armadillo does not warrant a stop sign. It was further discussed that additional traffic is in the area due to the construction project on North 60<sup>th</sup> Street.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Milwaukee County Transit Bus Routes 12 and 276 – North Green Bay Road and West Cherrywood Lane

Chief Kass advised that buses for routes 12 and 276 stage on West Cherrywood Lane and that the bus for route 49 stages further south by the Green Court Apartments. It was reported that when bus 49 leaves its staging area it goes onto the frontage road and that buses were stopping side by side and talking blocking the roadway. He reported that he has spoken to the transit authority to alleviate this particular incident.

Sharon Floryance, 4134 West Cherrywood Lane. Ms. Floryance reported that one of the buses stops in front of their underground parking garage prohibiting entrance at certain times as you cannot turn right in front of a bus. She further stated that it blocks the vision of many drivers.

Christine Sowinski, 4106 West Cherrywood Lane. Ms. Sowinski reported that an Ozaukee Cab Company cab also parks in the bus area.

Ms. Floryance and Ms. Sowinski further stated that the roadway was deteriorating where the busses were parking. Chief Kass reported that the Milwaukee County Transit System were in the process of evaluating the new Route 276 ridership and that would determine if they would be installing permanent concrete pads for the bus to park on. He further stated that he would advise Matthew Maederer of the road conditions.

Ms. Floryance further mentioned that school buses park on the frontage roads during school days which utilizes numerous parking spots that residents need for guests and themselves. Chief Kass stated that the school bus issue would be reviewed after the school year starts.

VII. ADJOURNMENT
