- The Assistant Village Manager prepared a Request for Proposal document to conduct a survey on the demands of the portable generator.
- The Assistant Manager helped organize the 4th of July parade order.




Park and Recreation



- The 4th of July Committee and the Park and Recreation Department would like to thank all those who volunteered and assisted with this year's celebration.
- Pond attendance of 5,117 through the first 28 days of swimming, compared to 2,829 through the first 28 days of the 2011 season.
- Session III of morning swim lessons will begin July 16th at the Pond.
- Director is in the process of finalizing the Capital Improvement Fund items for the Park and Recreation Department's 2013 CIP Budget.
- **Village Park Permits are now available and issued on a first come, first serve basis during regular office hours Monday through Friday.** The facilities include a shelter area, grill, volleyball court, horseshoe court and children's play area. Park Permit fees must be paid in full at the time the reservation is filled. Pond Admission Fees will be charged in addition to the Permit Fee and will be assessed the day of the event. A Clean up Deposit Fee will also be charged the day of the event and will be returned if the shelter and park area are left in good condition. **Shelters can be permitted through Sunday, September 30th.**

Community Services



- The Building Inspection Department conducted 22 inspections and issued 27 permits across all categories. Other major ongoing progress inspections continue at The Tile Shop, HHGregg, Brown Deer High School, Concentra, Academy of Dance Arts and Bradley Crossing. Currently working on 12 Compliance Applications and have issued two Compliance Certificates for properties. Team Knockout located at 6780 West Brown Deer Road has been issued a Stop Work Order due to their inability to obtain a Certificate of Occupancy permit because of code violations. Philgood's Barber and Beauty Salon at 4823 West Bradley was issued Occupancy and is open for business as of July 3, 2012.
- The Engineering and GIS Manager finished final compilation of streets to be included in the 2012 Cracksealing Project. The Village will join several other North Shore communities in bidding out the annual street maintenance work.
- The Engineering and GIS Manager continued editing and updating various system maps, such as water mains and sanitary sewers. This is in advance of transferring all or most of the infrastructure data to the new mapping software recently purchased by the Village to make records available to Village staff via the Internet, as well for reference by the public.
- The Community Development Director, along with Department Staff, finalized a proposed Capital Improvement Budget for 2013-2017.

Public Works



- The Department continues with yard complaint inspections (125) and issuance of code violations, cuttings and billings.
- The Department has two watering trucks operating to keep ditches, planting beds, new trees and bushes watered due to the lack of rain. This extra watering puts a strain on schedules for other projects.
- Staff is working on the 2013-17 CIP revisions and additions.
- City of Milwaukee personnel viewed the Village's topsoil screening unit in operation as a final step in determining what type of screener the City will purchase.
- Intern continues to work on the data for the SLAMM program and keeping markings fresh for ditching. Work continues on storm utility catch basin repairs/adjustments on streets to be repaved.
- Awaiting Outdoor Lighting scheduling to install the street name signs on the State highways. On June 28th, D.C. Burbach will begin curb and gutter work prior to infra-red heat rehab.
- Curb replacements on West Wahner Avenue, North 56th Street, and North Park Plaza Court have been patched and drives/curb/walk that needed replacement have been removed. Staff met with WDOT personnel on the relocation of traffic signal detection loops on North Park Plaza Court before pavement restoration. One culvert on North 37th Street was replaced and another removed.

Weekly Health Tip

Some types of blue-green algae, also known as pond scum, can be toxic and should be avoided. Some of the toxins can cause illness and even death in humans and animals. It's hard to know which are toxic so it's best to avoid all algae. If exposure occurs, rinse off immediately with soap and water. Be alert for symptoms such as skin rash or trouble breathing and call for help if these occur.

North Shore Health Department

- Our Child Passenger Safety Technician, along with other technicians, assisted 28 people at a SafeKids.org event last week. Car seats were installed and caregivers were educated on safe fitting, adjustment and positioning of child restraints. The car seat checks take from 30-90 minutes for each car.
- In the third week of the month, Immunization Clinics are on July 17th from 7:30-9:00 a.m., in the Shorewood office and July 18th from 3:30-4:30 p.m., at the Brown Deer Office. Please call 371-2980 for an appointment.
- The Adult Health clinic (cholesterol/lipid panel, glucose screening, blood pressure check, and consultation with an RN) is in the Brown Deer office on July 18th, from 8:00 – 10:00 a.m. The fee is \$25 and an appointment is needed.
- The sanitarian inspected 11 temporary restaurants serving food on the 4th of July Holiday.

Water




- ◆ Operating the Booster Disinfection station, which is increasing the incoming chloramines residual from 1.0 ppm (parts per million) to 1.5 ppm.
