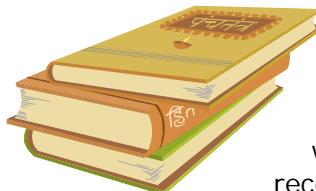

Village Manager

- The Village Manager and Administrative Services staff met with representatives of Baker Tilly to review the audit process.
- I attended a Library Board meeting on March 29. The Library Board reviewed the recruitment process for a new Director, and appointed Mary Dunn as the interim Library Director after Joe Rice leaves on April 6.
- I participated in oral interviews for the vacant Police Captain position.
- Jill and I held an informational meeting with the election workers on March 31 to review the election process.
- Bridget and I met with the municipal judge to review coordination of the municipal court and citation process.
- I attended the graduation ceremony for the Citizen Police Academy.



Library



- This week's highlighted free database is **NoveList**, which provides access to full text reviews, annotations, publication information, subject headings and for more than 12,000 works of fiction. You can use this database to get recommendations for similar titles and authors based on authors and titles that you have previously enjoyed.
- The Friends of the Library will hold their annual Plant Sale this year in cooperation with the Village's Beautification Committee. Administrative Services



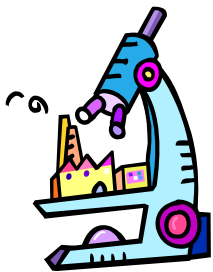
- Administrative Services staff held a progress meeting with the Village's auditors. Everything is on track for the auditors to be at Village Hall the week of April 26th and May 3rd to complete the audit.
- The Treasurer/Comptroller and Village Manager met with the Municipal Court Judge, David Victor, regarding the working relationship between the court and the Administration Department.
- The Treasurer/Comptroller completed and submitted the newly required worksheet to the Department of Revenue reporting the 2010 budgeted expenditures for Emergency Services.

Water

- Installed bulk meter filling station for contractors that need to fill up water trucks. Right now the road contractor for the Brown Deer bridge over Interstate 43 is using this filling site. We require a permit to use this filling station.
- Replacing some larger meters at apartment buildings and hotels that need to have their "combination meter" replaced. A combination meter measures both high flow rates and low flow rates accurately.
- Held preconstruction conference with Wanasek Construction who will do the water main relays this year. Work is anticipated to start the Week of April 12th. Letters were delivered to affected property owners.



Community Services



- Staff attended the Granville Brown Deer Chamber Business Expo and distributed materials about development opportunities, permits, inspections, and informed attendees about new Village communication tools and the 2010 Census.
- Staff met with a representative from American Tower Company to discuss revised locations for ground support equipment related to Clearwire's proposed wireless internet antennas. Staff is working to ensure that the ground equipment does not interfere with existing communication devices and Village Hall HVAC units.
- Conducted progress inspections at JFS elderly housing project and various home improvement projects.
- Issued a remodeling permit to Boldt Construction for offices at FIS, 4900 West Brown Deer Road.
- Conducted a pre-construction meeting with Village staff and staff from The Wanasek Corporation, the contractor awarded the contract for the 2010 Watermain Relay Project.
- Reviewed the construction plans for the signal installation project for the intersection of Arbon Drive and West Brown Deer Road.
- Reviewed a portion of the 2010 Asphalt Paving Project contract documents currently being assembled by the Village of Whitefish Bay on behalf of several North Shore communities through a joint bidding process. The paving project will occur after the watermain relay project is completed.

Public Works



- Continued with street sweeping operations.
- The contractor has started working on replacing the roof at the Public Works facilities.

- The Department assisted with preparation for the April 6 elections.

North Shore Health Department

- Prominent illnesses reported in Milwaukee County include upper respiratory problems including colds (rhinovirus) and some pneumonias. There have been no positive tests for Influenza type B. No communicable disease surveys were completed since the area schools are on spring break. The next surveys will include a two weeks period.
- Staff members provided a display and met the public at the Brown Deer – Granville Business Expo. Discount coupons were offered for some of the Health Department services, such as vaccinations and cholesterol screenings.
- A staff member provided blood pressure screenings at the Algonquin Bradley Manor Senior Fair on March 20th. Literature on controlling blood pressure and on health department services was available.

- ❑ On March 25th, the department conducted its monthly command staff meeting. At this meeting, Public Information Officer training was conducted by Anne E. Schwartz of the Milwaukee Police Department.
- ❑ The department conducted week eight of the Brown Deer Citizen's Police Academy.
- ❑ On March 30th, oral interviews were conducted for the position of Police Captain.
- ❑ Chief Rinzel attended the meeting of the Brown Deer Police Commission

Criminal Investigation/Youth Services

- ❑ The Investigative Bureau conducted follow-up investigation on 13 cases and took six cases to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office for charging.
- ❑ The Juvenile Officers reviewed 18 juvenile cases, counseled ten juveniles and their parents, referred two juveniles to the Milwaukee County Children's Court Center for charging and three juveniles to the Brown Deer Municipal Court.
- ❑ The School Liaison Officers spent 18 hours at the Brown Deer Schools.

Training

- ❑ Sergeant Schmitz attended Supervisor Legal Update training held in Hartford on March 26th.
- ❑ On March 30th and 31st, Officer Hansen attended Fingerprint Recovery Class held at the Milwaukee State Crime Lab.

Park and Recreation

- Residents can now register for the summer programs. Nonresidents may begin to register for programs starting May 3. If you are a student of the Brown Deer School District but a non-resident you may also register immediately with the residents.
- Staff promoted our programs at the Brown Deer/Grandville Chamber of Commerce Expo on March 25.
- Director attended the WPRA Parks & Recreation Spring Workshop on March 25 and 26. Workshop consisted of park design, redesign, planning and maintenance and facility tours.
- Pre-season work has started at Fairy Chasm Park with the prepping of the soccer fields and the ball diamonds for practices.
- **Special Program Offering:** The North Shore Fire Department will present a program for seniors to provide tips on how to prevent falls and fires. This program will be held from 1:15 to 2:45 p.m. on **Wednesday, April 14** at the Brown Deer Senior Citizens Center, St. Paul's Lutheran Church, and will be open to the general public.
