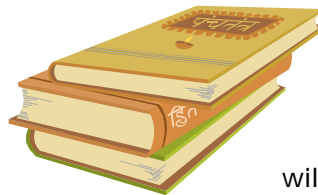

Library



- The Library staff and others said farewell and thank you to Director, Joseph Rice, who accepted a position in his home state of South Carolina. Many positive improvements were made in the library under Joe's leadership and he will be greatly missed.
- Children, ages 11 and under, are invited to participate in the *Annual Culver's Coloring Contest* sponsored by the Library and Culver's. Entry forms are available from a Reference Librarian and are due by April 30th. Each participant will receive a coupon for a free one-scoop cone of Culver's delicious custard. In early May, a raffle will be held to determine the winner of the Kid's Meal.
- This week's highlighted free database is the *Literary Reference Center*. The Literary Reference Center (LRC) is a highly graphical interface intended for public, academic and high school libraries. The primary goal of LRC is to assist high school and undergraduate English and Humanities students with homework and research assignments of a literary nature. Administrative Services



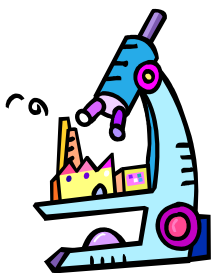
- § The Village closed and accepted funds for the \$5,355,000 debt issue on April 5th.
- § Staff held a conference call reviewing the current banking services and has identified solutions that will save the Village roughly \$6,000 annually in bank fees.
- § The Village currently offers the option to pay their court citations with a credit card. This option costs the Village \$1,800 annually. I received a contract from Official Payments Corporation which would allow the Village to collect taxes, utility bills, and court citations using a debit/credit card or an e-check at no cost to the Village. Official Payments Corporation can allow us to extend this service to virtually every area where we accept a payment if the Village chooses to. A set fee would be charged to the customer who chooses to use a credit card and not the Village. Citizens have the option to pay over the internet or via the telephone.

Water

- ◆ Coordinated a site visit at the standpipe for Clear Wire who is investigating the potential use of the standpipe for the proposed Wi-Fi system.
- ◆ Coordinated access to the standpipe for AT&T who is replacing antennae on the standpipe
- ◆ Delivered letters to residents along the 2010 water main relay projects. These projects are expected to start the week of April 12th



Community Services



- Conducted a final inspection at FIS for the generator room.
- Issued a permit for a fire restoration job on North 63rd Street.
- Compliance inspections are picking up with approximately one inspection a day being conducted. Re-inspections and Certificates of Compliance are being issued.
- Recorded a Certified Survey Map (CSM) at the Milwaukee County Register of Deeds. The map splits the property at 8710 North Deerwood Drive into two parcels. Along with the CSM the Village also completed paperwork that would purchase the new southern parcel from the current owners, Shoreland Community Church, so that a stormwater detention facility can be created.
- Reviewed a sign permit application for a monument sign at 8755 North Deerwood Drive. The sign is for Wade Weissmann Architecture and new tenant Peabody's Interiors.
- Investigated multiple property maintenance and junk vehicle complaints. Investigations identified multiple zoning violations. Complaints included residential and commercial properties on Woods Circle, North 57th Street, Silverleaf Lane, Bradley Road and Carlotta Lane. With the recent warm weather, complaints have increased.

Public Works



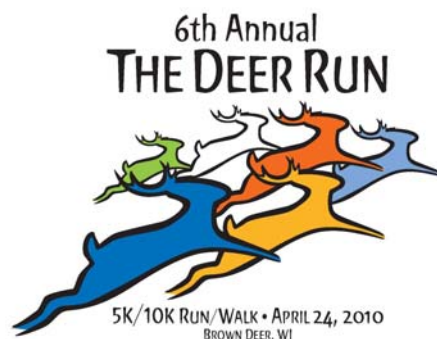
- Continued with street sweeping operations.

North Shore Health Department

- H1N1 infection has not increased in Wisconsin as it has in the southeastern part of the country. Health officials continue to encourage vaccination for H1N1, especially for those in high risk categories. Vaccine is plentiful and it is not yet known if a third wave of infections will develop. The Health Department continues to offer H1N1 immunization at all regularly scheduled clinics.



- A staff member watched an Immunization Net Conference on new recommendations for PCV13 (pneumococcal vaccine) for children. This vaccine adds six strains of disease protection in addition to the seven being currently being given.
- The Health Department has agreed once again to work with students from the Milwaukee School of Engineering nursing program for the spring semester. The students will work with staff on April 28, May 5 and 12 for an introduction to community health.

Police



- ❑ On Thursday, April 1st, the department conducted the graduation ceremony for the 23rd class of the Brown Deer Citizen's Police Academy. Captain Peter Nimmer of the Burlington Police Department was the guest speaker for the 14 graduates and 50 past graduates in attendance.
- ❑ Officer Caddock and K-9 Justis made a training presentation to The American Legion Post #406 on April 7th.

Criminal Investigation/Youth Services

- ❑ The Investigative Bureau conducted follow-up investigation on seven cases and took six cases to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office for charging.

- ❑ From April 5th to 9th, Officer Fus and Dispatcher Junk attended Composite Drawing and Facial Recognition training held in Delafield.
- ❑ Officer Hansen attended the Annual Traffic and Impaired Driving Conference held in Appleton on April 6th and 7th.

- The Summer Program Flier is now on the Village website. Residents may begin to register immediately and Nonresidents may begin to register for programs starting May 3.
- Staff continues to contact staff from last year to see who is returning for 2010.
- The ball diamonds and soccer fields at Fairy Chas Park are open for practices. The restrooms will officially open for the season on May 9th.
- 4th of July Committee kicked off its annual raffle on Tuesday, April 6. Sales for the day totaled \$694. Committee would like to thank the volunteers who sold tickets.
