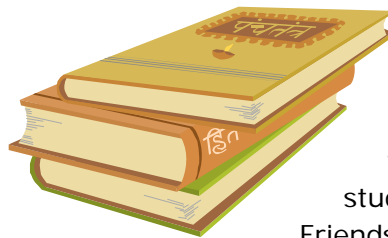

Village Manager

- Jane Peterson and I met with representatives from the Village of Shorewood to answer questions about the North Shore Health Department and a proposal for Shorewood/Whitefish Bay Health Department to consolidate with the NSHD. We also discussed the potential for an interim agreement.
- Jesse and I met with Alan Marcuvitz and John Fuchs to discuss possible economic incentive options for property outside the tax increment districts. Possible programs are being explored.
- Staff met with a representative from Milwaukee County Emergency Government regarding the status of an emergency warning siren on N. 55th Street, which is currently not functioning. The Village is responsible for its repair and staff will be meeting with American Signal next week to explore options.

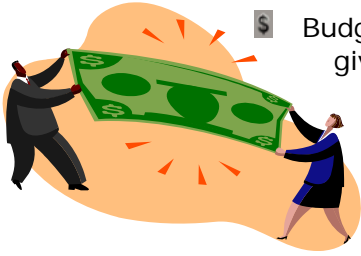


Library

- June 30 marked Mary Dunn's **30th** anniversary with the Library. Congratulations Mary! And thank you for all your hard work and dedication!

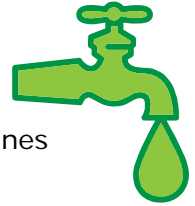
Administrative Services



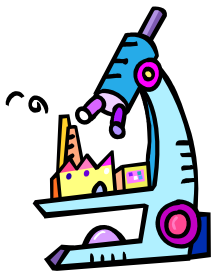
- § Budget files were distributed to department heads. Again this year all files were given out electronically rather than in printed format in order to reduce costs and be more “green”.
- § The Department is handling increased foot traffic at the counter due to water bill payments due June 29th.

Water

- ◆ Continued the “Big Flush” cleaning program in area 5, between W. Brown Deer Road and W. County Line Road, from N. 68th Street to N. 51st Street.
- ◆ Work continues on the 2010 valve maintenance program in the Village.
- ◆ Operating the Booster Disinfection station, which is increasing the incoming chloramines residual from 1.0 ppm (parts per million) to 2.0 ppm.
- ◆ Made sure existing water pipes were not damaged as the Village sewer contractor repaired sewer lines below and near the water pipes
- ◆ Attended the American Water Works conference in Chicago, which was paid for with City Water funds and not charged to the Village. The conference is the largest water meeting in the world. Highlights related to Brown Deer included the Badger Meter and Thermofisher exhibits. Attended interesting technical talks on water main flushing and backflow prevention that were provided as part of the educational program.



Community Services



- Met with representatives of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation to discuss their preliminary plans for improvements to the intersection of N. 51st Street and W. Brown Deer Road. These improvements would include new signals, crosswalks, and offset turn lanes among others. Staff inquired about the addition of sidewalks, the widening of turn radii and the inclusion of right turn lanes as a part of this project. The project is in early development stages with a potential for construction in 2011.
- Joined School District representatives on a conference call regarding the Safe Routes to School Program. Staff is working with the District to identify appropriate projects that could qualify for application in the 2010 grant cycle.
- The Building Inspector conducted a final occupancy inspection at Deerwood Crossing, 4195 W. Bradley Rd., and issued permission for occupancy. There are still items to be completed before the Certificate of Occupancy will be issued. The Planning/Zoning Specialist inspected the project to determine if site improvements were satisfactorily completed. Several outstanding items were noted related to storm water management, landscaping and site design.
- Building Board approved plans for a new single family dwelling in the Deer Brook Estates Subdivision.
- Conducted an occupancy inspection with Matt Mertons from the NSFD for a day care use at 4815 W. Bradley Rd. Generated a punch list of items to be completed.
- Staff conducted a pre-bid walk-thru for replacing the entry doors in Village Hall.

Public Works



- Began marking out streets for the paving projects that will start after the 4th of July.
- Vandals have been damaging the planters in the front of the Village Hall on court nights and over this past weekend.
- Summer help is obtaining elevations of road crossing culverts and tying them into the sanitary elevation data base. This will provide the Village a full cross-tie of the sanitary and storm water systems. They also continue with manhole lid replacement.
- Had a meeting with an in state bridge company for the replacement of the pedestrian bridge at the Library. This item will be added to the CIP for 2011.
- Great Lakes continued with testing and sealing sewers in the Village. This work will continue through the summer.
- Adkins Construction has finished with the manhole and lateral repairs and completed one extra lateral repair that was found by Great Lakes during the sealing operation.
- Some trees in the medians are being defoliated by caterpillars, but these should re-leaf within the next weeks.

North Shore Health Department



- 75% of local restaurant, pool, and hotel operators have renewed their licenses with the North Shore Environmental Health Consortium. A late fee will be assessed after July 1 to those who have not renewed by the June 30 deadline.
- The Suburban Milwaukee/Ozaukee County Tobacco Free Coalition is hosting an event at Erv's Mug in Oak Creek on July 5th from 4:00 – 9:00 p.m. to celebrate the implementation of Wisconsin's status as a smoke-free state. The multi-jurisdictional coalition has been very actively involved in the smoke-free initiative. Information packets and signage regarding the new state law have been distributed to all businesses to assist with implementation.
- The second quarter report for the America Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) grant funding has been filed. Grant objectives include efforts to increase all adult immunizations and to increase the number of flu immunizations for children. The Health Department will collaborate with local day care centers to provide opportunities for flu immunization of children in day care.

Police



- ❑ The department conducted its monthly command staff meeting on June 24th.
- ❑ On June 25th, Chief Rinzel attended Sergeant Schmitz' graduation from the Northwestern Executive Management Program held in Port Washington.
- ❑ The department conducted command staff interviews for five entry level desk/patrol officer candidates.
- ❑ Chief Rinzel attended a meeting with Milwaukee County Emergency Government to discuss the emergency sirens in the Village.
- ❑ The department has been working with the Department of Public Works and the Park and Recreation Department preparing for the upcoming 4th of July Celebration in the Village.
- ❑ Officer Caddock met with a Village resident regarding the Neighborhood Watch Group.

Criminal Investigations/Youth Services

- ❑ The Investigative Bureau conducted follow-up investigation on five cases and took five cases to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office for charging.
- ❑ Juvenile Officers reviewed two juvenile cases.
- ❑ The School Liaison Officers spent four hours at the Brown Deer Schools.
