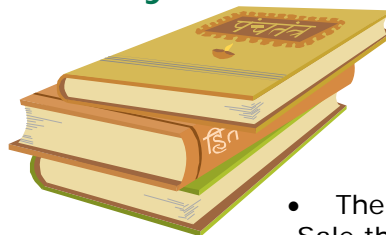
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Village Manager

- I taught a budgeting class at the Clerk/Treasurer Institute sponsored by UW-Green Bay on July 14th.
- I will be attending the summer meeting of CVMIC on July 15 and 16.

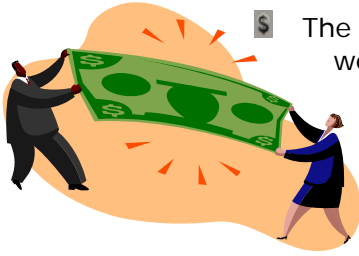


Library

- Continued work on the 2011 budget specifically concentrating on Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) requests.
- I have been asked to serve on the Board of the Wisconsin Library Association Foundation. The Foundation's role is to promote libraries as essential institutions. The 9 member Board is comprised of library directors from public, academic and special libraries from across the state. I attended my first Board meeting on July 14th in Madison.

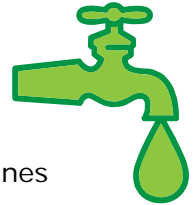


§ The Village's Deputy Treasurer/Comptroller is attending her second year at the week long Treasurer's Institute in Green Bay.

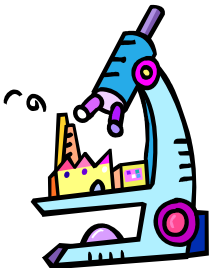
§ The Treasurer/Comptroller is continuing to work on the capital improvement and budget requests received from departments as part of the five year capital planning process and annual budget process.

Water

- ◆ Continued the "Big Flush", our annual cleaning program of the water pipes in area 6, the northeast part of the Village
- ◆ Continued work on the 2010 valve maintenance program in the Village.
- ◆ Operating the Booster Disinfection station, which is increasing the incoming chloramines residual from 1.0 ppm (parts per million) to 2.0 ppm.
- ◆ Located and isolated a main break on Green Bay Road transmission main on Friday night, July 9, 2010.
- ◆ Marking valve boxes for street repaving project which is scheduled for the week of July 19th.



Community Services



- Met with Outdoor Lighting, the Village's street lighting maintenance contractor, at Arbon Drive and West Brown Deer Road to discuss the impact of the upcoming traffic signal installation project on the Village's street light systems on both sides of the intersection.
- Sent a letter to residents living on the streets to be paved in 2010 informing them of the paving contractor's schedule. Work is planned to begin the week of July 19, weather permitting.
- Reviewed the final plan and issued the right of way permit to CableComm for their proposed fiber optic cable installation to serve the FIS building, 4900 West Brown Deer Road.
- Worked with the School District to write and submit a grant application for "Safe Routes to School". The grant requests funding to construct a section of sidewalk along Dean Road from Teutonia Avenue to 55th Street and a multi-modal loop trail through the school campus.
- Prepared a development agreement for Larry's Market governing its use as a grocery, restaurant along with associated outdoor dining and sales. The agreement will be reviewed by the Plan Commission on Monday July 12, 2010.
- Submitted an application for WaterStar Wisconsin, a new statewide program that evaluates local municipal efforts to protect and promote water resources. Policies on land use, water supply, waste water and stormwater were reviewed and the Village has tentatively scored high enough to receive a bronze star rating.

Public Works



- Continued marking out streets for the paving projects that will start the week of July 19th.
- Clearing of overgrowth on bike path.
- Summer help continues with obtaining elevations of road crossing culverts and tying them into the sanitary elevation data base. They also continue with manhole lid replacement.
- Great Lakes continues with testing and sealing sewers in the Village.
- Continue to receive and respond to resident concerns regarding uncut grass, weeds, etc. Brush cutting throughout the Village.

North Shore Health Department



- The North Shore Environmental Health Consortium has issued all but 14% of food, pool, and restaurant licenses. Overdue notices will be sent to those still outstanding at the end of the week.
- Water quality at Tietjen Beach at Doctor's Park has been good and the beach has remained open with no closures to date.
- Health Department staff is participating in a research study through the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. This study is focused on the roles and responsibilities of public health personnel in a variety of emergencies including anthrax exposure, dirty bomb, or a weather related incident.

Police



- ❑ The Chief attended the meeting of the Traffic and Public Safety Committee on July 8th.
- ❑ On July 8th, the Brown Deer Police Department and the North Shore Health Department completed the Second Chance Program for area juveniles.
- ❑ Chief Rinzel participated in a meeting with representatives of American Signal Corporation to discuss the changeover of the village sirens.
- ❑ The Brown Deer Police Department hosted the monthly training for the Milwaukee County K9 group on July 12th.
- ❑ On Wednesday July 14th, the Chief attended the monthly meeting of the North Shore Police Chiefs.

Criminal Investigations/Youth Services

- ❑ During the past week the Investigative Bureau conducted follow-up investigation on 17 cases and took 13 cases to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office for charging.
- ❑ The Juvenile Officers reviewed 4 juvenile cases, counseled 2 juveniles and their parents, referred 2 juveniles to the Milwaukee County Children's Court Center for charging, and referred 2 juveniles to the Brown Deer Municipal Court.

Park and Recreation

- Summer Playground went to Discovery World on Wednesday, July 14.
- Youth Sport Club went to Prairieville Park in Waukesha on July 15.
- Director continued to review Capital Improvement Projects for the upcoming budget.
- The Pond hours for the season will be 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily, weather permitting. Daily admission fees are children 2 years and younger free, children 3-7 years of age \$2.00, residents \$2.50, nonresidents \$4.50 and seniors \$1.75.
- Pond attendance through Tuesday, July 13 was 3,969.
