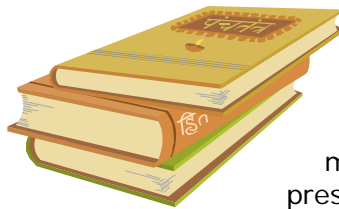

- I attended the command staff meeting of the Police Department to review the Personnel Manual.

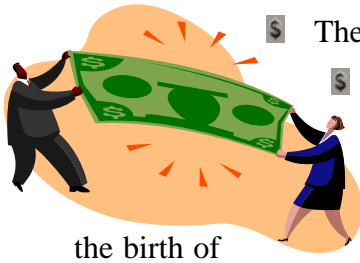


Library

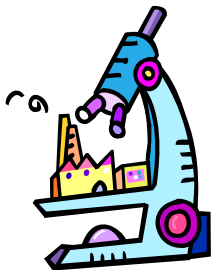
- § The Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) is completed and being printed.
- § Completed the June tax settlement process. Tax collections from April and May were \$2,366,861 which was 7.8% of the total levy. This is on par with past years' collections for this timeframe.
- § Congratulations to Bridget Souffrant (Village's Treasurer/Comptroller) on her daughter Isabella Marie.

Water

- ◆ Performed maintenance on Utility dump truck
- ◆ Continue with the Big Flush program by completing Area 2 (bounded by Bradley, 68th Street, Dean, and 51st Street) and starting Area 3 (bounded by Bradley, 51st, Brown Deer, and Teutonia).
- ◆ Started up the Booster Disinfection Station since incoming water supply temperatures are approximately 55 degrees. Incoming chloramine level from Milwaukee is about 1.1 parts per million. We boost that level to about 2.0 parts per million at the Booster Disinfection Station so that a level near 0.5 parts per million is maintained throughout the distribution system.



Community Services



- Participated in a phone call with SEWRPC's chief engineer to discuss the timing of the submittal to FEMA of the revised Beaver Creek floodplain maps. SEWRPC will attempt to submit them to FEMA before the end of 2010; FEMA will take approximately one year to complete their review and make them official regulatory maps.
- Answered contractor's questions for the Village Park Bike Path & Railroad Crossing Project, and issued Addendum #1 to the bid documents.
- Attended the final Public Information Meeting for the Original Village Streetscape Project. Public Interest was high as approximately 40 residents were in attendance.
- Coordinated the field installation of two railroad crossing locations with personnel from CN Railroad. The track crossings are now in place on the south side of Brown Deer Road and near the east end of Village Park. The Village will be adding asphalt approaches and other improvements later this summer in order to complete the crossing connections to Arbon Drive and the Village's Recreational Trail.
- Investigated property maintenance and commercial vehicle parking in the 6600 block of West Brown Deer Road
- The Planning and Zoning Specialist reviewed a proposed landscaping maintenance plan for the north side of the Lowe's property at 6300 W. Brown Deer Road. This area has been the site of numerous complaints about poor landscape conditions and accumulation of junk and debris. The new plan will address areas of dead growth, plant new shade tolerant evergreens and add a layer of mulch along the fence line to control weeds. Bi-annual maintenance is also proposed.
- Worked with Traffic Analysis & Design and Kapur & Associates to prepare the bidding documents for the Arbon Drive – Brown Deer Road intersection.

Public Works



- Working with TAPCO to test two solar powered street name signs at the corner of Deerwood and River Lane.
- Re-touching up the spring touch up of last year's ditch rehab projects due to the "Big Flush" that the Water Utility dumped down the ditches and flushed away our work, which some residents are not appreciating.
- Working with Canadian National Railroad to have their drainage ditch cleaned out from the north end of Fairy Chasm Lane south towards Beaver Creek. The Village has a storm sewer that discharges to this ditch and it has filled up over the years to where it is critical that it be cleaned out.
- Great Lakes continued with testing and sealing sewers in the Village. This work will continue through the summer.
- The department is in the process of converting old sewer video tapes into electronic files and DVD's and surveying manholes for lid replacements
- Receiving newer information as to the treatment of ash trees for EAB to determine its cost effectiveness and what type of treatment program may or should be established.

North Shore Health Department



- Beach water testing has started at all the North Shore Beaches. Signs are posted with safety advisories based on the test results. Visit the website, www.wibeaches.us, for more and up-to-date information on water quality.
- All staff attended CPR and AED training through the American Red Cross taught by Kathleen Demein, RN at the Shorewood/Whitefish Bay Health Department.
- In reviewing the Milwaukee County Communicable Diseases report from January to May 2010 as compared with 2009, there has been a decrease in total number of several communicable diseases. Decreases were reported in Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Pertussis, Mumps, Salmonellosis, and Tuberculosis. However, Hepatitis C, Giardiasis, and Legionellosis increased over the same time frame.

Park and Recreation

- Recreation Supervisor recertified Pond Guards in Lifeguarding on June 9th. Held in-service training on June 10 and 11 to practice the Pond's Emergency Action Plan.
- Pond officially opened on June 15th. The pond is scheduled to be open until August 15th with the hours of operation at 11:00 am to 5:00 pm daily, weather permitting. Pond will have special hours on July 4th (12:00 to 5:00 pm) and closed on July 5. Daily admission fees are free for children 2 years and younger, \$2.00 for children 3-7, residents \$2.50, nonresidents \$4.50 and seniors \$1.75. Memberships are also available for purchase.
- Accepting registrations for summer programs. Openings remain in the following Youth programs: Summer Playground, Youth Sports Club, T-Ball, Track and Field, Tennis Lessons, Drama, Arts and Crafts, Academy of Dance, Playtime at the Piano, Golf Lessons, and Volleyball Camp
- Evening Swim Lessons begin the week of June 21. Morning Lessons begin the week of July 6. Mornings and Evening Lessons still have openings. All swim Lessons will be held at the Pond.
