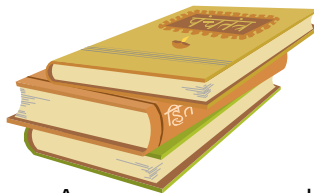

- I attended the Region 7 meeting of the Wisconsin City Managers on May 26th.



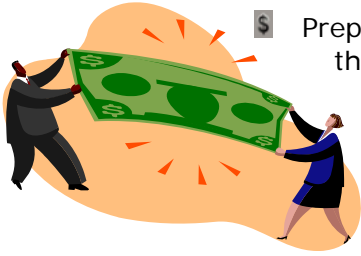
## Library

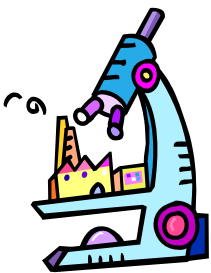
## Water

- ◆ Testing was successfully completed on new water mains installed along West Kirchoff Avenue and North Green Bay Road. Service laterals are now being reconnected.
- ◆ Field staff received water quality training and a special tour of the North Shore Water treatment plant in Glendale.
- ◆ Prepared materials for a May 25th Water Commission meeting, including information related to the contested Milwaukee Water rate case.
- ◆ The Big Flush started on May 25th in the Southeast part of the Village. Signs will be posted in neighborhoods where flushing occurs.
- ◆ Performed water meter reading for quarterly bills scheduled to go out at the end of May.

## Community Services



- Participated in the second Local Officials Technical Meeting for the WISDOT Environmental Justice Analysis of West Brown Deer Road. The analysis is an exercise to determine the traffic and pedestrian needs along the corridor and provide solutions.
- Created maps for the Department of Public Works for their use in their summer sanitary sewer manhole inspection program.
- Staff met with representatives of Independence First and the US District Attorney's Office to determine access opportunities at the River Revitalization Foundation Natural Area for persons with disabilities.
- Met with the developers of Most Precious Moments, 8200 North Teutonia Avenue, to discuss the possible Tax Incremental Financing assistance.
- The Planning/Zoning Specialist participated in a career day event at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee where information regarding local government planning, economic development and administration was shared with master degree students.
- Conducted progress inspections at the JFS elderly housing project.
- Cardinal Chemical is proposing to occupy a warehouse building in the BD Business Park. Staff met with various representatives to discuss the proposed storage of hazardous chemicals in the building. Explained what is required to comply with the International Building Code to store hazardous chemicals in this building.
- The Village's Building Inspector has been re-appointed by Governor Doyle to the State of Wisconsin Dwelling Code Council. This 18-member statutory council, appointed by the Governor, advises the Department of Commerce on uniform rules for the construction of one- and two-family dwellings.

## Public Works



Village and Green Bay Court sewer projects for this fall.

- Reviewed Original Village plans in walking tour with Ayers and streetscape plans for open house in June.
- Great Lakes is sealing sewers in the Village. This work will continue through the summer.
- Met with MMSD regarding the Original Village and Green Bay Court sewer projects for this fall.
- Finished work on WDNR CMAR report for 2009.
- Finished with planting replacements—ash replacement and other trees. Planters in front of the Village Hall are to be planted.
- Attended I43 Emergency Alternate Route meeting.
- Received a notice from WDOT regarding a potential 2011 project to reconstruct the intersection of West Brown Deer Road and North 51st Street.
- Finished working on list of setup work for pond and park facilities.

## North Shore Health Department



- The North Shore Environmental Health Consortium reports that there has been a good return of the food, pool, and hotel license applications and many of the licenses have already been issued for the 2010-2011 licensing period.
- This is the final week of collecting the school surveillance surveys for this school year. The final graphs recording absences and symptoms will be sent to the schools by the end of next week.
- The green sprouts are popping up in almost all of the containers behind the village hall. A great crew of volunteers has stepped up to volunteer time to water and tend these new plants.

## Police



- ❑ Chief Rinzel and the Brown Deer Police Commission conducted interviews of nine candidates for entry desk/patrol officer positions on May 20th.
- ❑ On May 26th, Chief Rinzel attended the monthly meeting of the Milwaukee County Law Enforcement Executives Association held in Shorewood.
- ❑ Officer Caddock attended the meeting of the Brown Deer Foundation where discussion took place on Brown Deer's Night Out activities which will take place on August 5, 2010. He also reviewed the After-Action Report for the Deer Run with the Foundation where very few issues were reported.
- ❑ Officer Caddock met with a Kohl's Department Store representative regarding volunteer opportunities; they have offered employees to volunteer at events which involve children.

## Criminal Investigation/Youth Services

- ❑ The Investigative Bureau conducted follow-up investigation on seven cases and took six cases to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office for charging.
- ❑ The Juvenile Officers counseled 15 juveniles and their parents and referred one juvenile to the Brown Deer Municipal Court.
- ❑ The School Liaison Officers spent 16 hours at the Brown Deer Schools.

## Training

- ❑ The department conducted intradepartmental training on Defense and Arrest Tactics (DAAT) and Vehicle Contacts on May 26th for the final third of the department's officers. This training was held at the Beloit Beverage facility.

## Park and Recreation

- Don't wait until the last minute to register for Youth and Adult Summer Programs. Three ways to register: by mail, drop box, or in person.
- Swim Lesson will move to the Pond for the summer while repairs are made to the High School Pool. The first session will be cancelled due to the likelihood that the morning weather may not be warm enough for younger children to be in the water. Sessions II and III, in the mornings will be held in the mornings at the Pond as originally scheduled. In addition, Evening lessons will also be held at the Pond between 5:30 and 8:00 depending on the age groups.
- Director attended the Board of Education meeting on May 24. Board approved the repairs for the pool.
- Supervisor attended Milwaukee Elks Lodge #46 meeting about the potential use of the Elks pool for summer swim lesson. It was decided by the Elks that they could not offer the facilities and work with our program because it would take away time when its members could use the pool.
