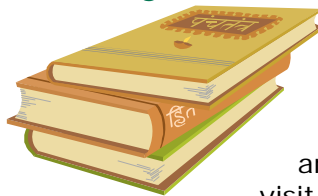

- I attended the swearing in ceremony for Robert Whitaker as the new Chief of the North Shore Fire Department on May 6th.

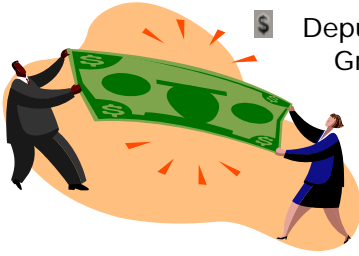


Library

§ Completed the final week of fieldwork for the 2009 annual audit.

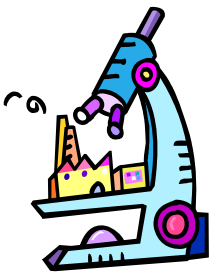
§ The May 5th Finance and Public Works Committee meeting was cancelled due to lack of quorum.

Water

- Construction continues on 2010 water main relay projects. Wanasek Construction started on North 48th Street, south of Dean Road.
- The Wisconsin Public Service Commission has filed their Cost of Service Study in relation to the Milwaukee Water Works application for a large water rate increase. On April 27th, water superintendents from West Allis, Wauwatosa, Menomonee Falls, Milwaukee County Grounds, Greendale, Shorewood, New Berlin, Mequon, and Brown Deer met to discuss the filings, receive input from our consultant team, and determine the next recommended steps.
- Work continues on the “Big Flush” plan for 2010, the purpose of this is to clean out the inside of the water pipe system. The flush will start soon.



Community Services



- Met on site with School District, DNR and MMSD officials to discuss design, grant funding and opportunities related to the creation of an on-campus trail system.
- Investigated exterior storage and parking of landscaping equipment at 8178 North Teutonia Avenue. Current parking is in violation of zoning requirements. The owner of the property, Hanson Storage, will be working with the Village to explore appropriate permitting.
- Compliance inspections have picked up and we are scheduling one a day.
- Did plan reviews and issued permits for several residential remodeling jobs and a couple of small commercial projects.
- Received a construction permit from the WI-DOT for the traffic signals at Arbon Drive and Brown Deer Road.

Public Works

North Shore Health Department



- Two staff members attended a Brown Deer School Grounds Committee meeting on April 27 to review the development of a fitness trail/walking path, and enhanced natural landscape and habitats for use in curriculums.
- Two MSOE nursing students spent their first day with Health Department staff on April 28. They assisted with immunizations and TB skin tests and participated in a staff wellness meeting.
- Several staff members attended the Spring Communicable Disease and Emergency Response Seminar hosted by the Division of Public Health held on May 3. Presentations included reviews of the February, 2010 legionella outbreak, the local emergency response to the water main break in South Milwaukee, the increase in HIV cases, enteric disease surveillance, and tuberculosis (about 70 cases a year).

Police



- ❑ On April 30th, Chief Rinzel, Captain Halverson and Lieutenant King attended the Fox Point review of their shooting incident from February 15, 2010.
- ❑ Chief Rinzel and Captain Graeber attended the meeting of the Village Board and made a presentation on the potential consolidated dispatch services and call taking; joining a combined dispatch center.
- ❑ Chief Rinzel met with Ozaukee County Police Chiefs on May 5th in Grafton.
- ❑ Officer Caddock and Officer Lesnik presented a bicycle safety program at Dean School on May 4th.

Criminal Investigation/Youth Services

- ❑ The Investigative Bureau conducted follow-up investigation on 12 cases and took five cases to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office for charging.
- ❑ The Juvenile Officers reviewed two juvenile cases and counseled seven juveniles and their parents and referred two juveniles to the Brown Deer Municipal Court.
- ❑ The School Liaison Officers spent 15 hours at the Brown Deer Schools.

Training

- ❑ On May 3rd and 4th, Officer Christianson attended Incident Based Reporting (IBR) training held in Madison.
- ❑ Sergeant Carver attended the Criminal Information Bureau meeting held at the Milwaukee County Safety Building on May 6th.
