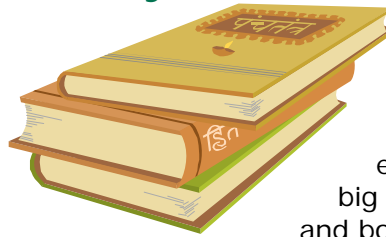

- § Continued the analysis of the operating budget requests received.

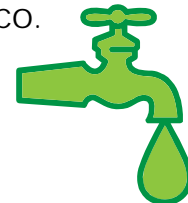


Police

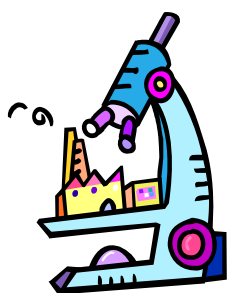
- No report.

Water

- ◆ New service lateral and plumbing passed all tests and water was turned on to TAPCO.
- ◆ Operating the Booster Disinfection station, which is increasing the incoming chloramines residual from 1.0 ppm (parts per million) to 2.0 ppm. Repaired an internal feed line and received a new shipment of sodium hypochlorite.
- ◆ Prepared quarterly water bills.
- ◆ Continued to monitor the Milwaukee Water Rate case filings and prepare for appropriate modification of Brown Deer water rates.



Community Services



- Investigated property maintenance and junk vehicle issues in the 4400 block of West Parkland Avenue.
- Worked with designers at Poblocki Sign Company to create a preliminary design for an electronic message center to compliment the existing Village sign along Brown Deer Road. The work was undertaken in order to get a better understanding of cost and sizing in order to appropriately locate the sign, perhaps as part of the Original Village streetscape project.
- The Building Inspector attended a building code upkeep committee meeting.
- Conducted Code Compliance inspections. Seeing a lot of foreclosed houses and short sales.
- Conducted a progress inspection at Anguil Environmental remodeling project.

Recycling Center

A new State electronics law went into effect in 2010 and residents can no longer bring their electronics to the recycling center.

Public Works



- Work continues on sidewalk/bike path by Terry's Excavating. A link from the bike path to the play structure area in Village Park was added to the project scope.

- Continue with street sweeping. Began ditching on Kirchhoff Avenue. A section east of 38th Street meets requirements of

the Village policy for a pipe to be installed due to the drop off from the road. The department will install a "Green Sewer" for this 250 ft. stretch as a test section. The "Green Sewer" was devised by the department using StormTech storm water storage units. This allows for a shallow top ditch and the system below stores, conveys and infiltrates storm water which reduces downstream peak flows. If the "Green Sewer" functions as designed, it would store and infiltrate more storm water than a normal 2' deep ditch and give the resident a shallow top ditch and there would be no or few culvert ends.

- Working on Private Property Inflow/Infiltration (PPII) project for MMSD funding. Great Lakes continues testing and grouting project.
- Continue to receive and respond to resident concerns regarding uncut grass, weeds, etc. Brush cutting throughout the Village.
- 2010 pavement marking work completed except for streets being paved.
- Mulch is available.

North Shore Health Department

- The Health Department has begun receiving flu vaccine in incremental shipments and should have an adequate supply for scheduled flu clinics. As in the past, a small amount of preservative free vaccine will be available for adults upon request. A regular flu shot will cost \$30 and a preservative free shot will cost \$35.00—the same prices as last year. Flu shots are free to those with Medicare Part B coverage.
- 86% of the pools inspected by Health Department staff are in compliance with the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act. This Act requires installation of anti-entrapment covers for skimmer equalizer lines and submerged drains and will prevent children and adults from getting trapped underwater by strong suction. The new safety equipment was to have been installed or "in process" of installation by 7/1/10. "In process" projects must be completed by 7/11/10.
