Activity Report:

During the month of June the Brown Deer Police Department responded to 1349 calls for service, issued 417 traffic citations, 111 parking citations and made 59 non-traffic related arrests/citations. Overall activity level was significantly higher when compared with the prior year.

Chief Kass and PIO Caddock attended the opening ceremony for the Milwaukee County Special Olympics Torch Run.


The bi-annual bike rodeo was held in the conjunction with the school district. The event was well attended.




2015/2016 Year to Date Calls for Service




2015/2016 Year to Date Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)




**Reported Crime Comparison

Year to Date**




Thefts – Includes Retail Thefts which account for approximately 55% of the total theft complaints.


North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction

School ended on June 8, 2016

The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Liaison Officer (SLO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SLO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SLO Presence – Time the officer was physically present in the school (includes time instructing DARE).

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.
