Activity Report:

During the month of October the Brown Deer Police Department responded to 985 calls for service, issued 163 traffic citations, 76 parking citations and made 71 non-traffic related arrests/citations. Overall activity level was slightly less when compared with the prior year.


Chief's Report




Like most communities within Milwaukee County and Southeast Wisconsin we're experiencing an increase in motor vehicle thefts. Year to date we've had 72 reported in the Village compared to 35 in all of 2014. Other crime trends have remained steady and the number of retail thefts shows signs of declining.


2014/2015 Year to Date Calls for Service




2014/2015 Year to Date Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)



Reported Crime Comparison October 2014/2015




Thefts – Includes Retail Thefts which account for approximately 55% of the total theft complaints.


North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction

The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Liaison Officer (SLO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SLO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SLO Presence – Time the officers were physically present in the school (includes time instructing DARE).

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.
