Chief's Report


We said our formal goodbyes to PO Jeanne Peterson this month who retired after serving 19 years with the PD.






2015/2016 Year to Date Calls for Service




2015/2016 Year to Date Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)




Reported Crime Comparison September 2015/2016



Reported Crime Comparison Year to Date




September 2016 Allocation of Police Services


Thefts – Includes Retail Thefts which account for approximately 55% of the total theft complaints.


North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction

The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Liaison Officer (SLO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SLO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SLO Presence – Time the officer was physically present in the school (includes time instructing DARE).

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.
