



During these times crashes most frequently occurred between 12:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. In this time period there were 115 crashes or 58% of the total crashes. The hour with the single most crashes during the year was from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. with 32 crashes or 16% of the total crashes.

DETECTIVE BUREAU

The Brown Deer Police Department Detective Bureau and Youth Services Bureau were involved in several notable investigations during 2009.

BANK ROBBERY

Patrol and Bureau personnel investigated an Armed Robbery which occurred at the US Bank, 4200 West Brown Deer Road. The suspect entered the bank, demanded money and fled the scene prior to officers' arrival. Detective Bureau Personnel processed the crime scene, which included the robbery note. The Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory process the robbery note and identified a suspect from latent prints. The subject was later apprehended and a search warrant was executed on his residence. The suspect is currently awaiting trial.

EXPOSING CHILD TO HARMFUL MATERIALS

The Detective Bureau Personnel investigated two separate complaints involving High School juveniles that were taking and sending nude and inappropriate photos to other juveniles. All juveniles were identified and referred to the Milwaukee County Children's Center for charges.

DISTRIBUTION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE

In November of 2009, Patrol received a complaint from the parent of a juvenile that was selling Adderall, a controlled substance, on High School property to other High School students. Patrol forwarded the information to the Detective Bureau personnel. After investigating the incident, there were 11 juveniles referred to the Milwaukee County Children's Center for charges and eight adults (17 years of age) referred to the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office for charges. The charges consisted of selling Adderall, purchasing Adderall without a prescription, and also selling/purchasing on School Property.

GRAFFITI

During the month of May 2009, our Agency responded to 12 gang affiliated Graffiti complaints. Detective Bureau personnel obtained investigatory leads from school contacts. This information led to two juvenile arrests, which was referred to the Milwaukee County Children's Center for charges.

DRUG INVESTIGATIONS

The Detective Bureau investigated numerous Drug Investigations that originated from anonymous tips and officer leads. Three of these investigations resulted in search warrants being obtained and executed. Arrests and charges were filed in all three cases by the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office.

BURGLARY

Patrol and Bureau personnel investigated two burglary complaints that occurred at local apartment complexes where large screen televisions were stolen from the community gathering rooms. Two suspects were identified during the investigation that led to a search warrant being executed at one of the suspect's houses where a stolen large screen television was recovered from a similar burglary that occurred in New Berlin. An arrest was made in the Brown Deer cases, and charges are still pending at the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office.

CHECK FORGERY RING

In February 2009, Patrol received a complaint of a check forgery ring operating at T.J. Maxx and Marshall's. The ring consisted of seven suspects who had passed 61 forged or worthless checks for a total loss of \$2,333.47. Patrol forwarded this information to the Detective Bureau, who worked with an investigator from T.J. Maxx and Marshall's to investigate the fraud ring. As a result of this investigation, several felony charges were issued by the Milwaukee County District Attorney's office against the suspects.

Youth Services – 2009

Officers Mark Rooney, Michael Lesnik, and Melissa Fus worked with the youth of the community throughout 2009.

Officer Mark Rooney served as the Youth Services Officer. Officer Rooney is responsible for administering the Second Chance program. This program allows first-time offenders who display an attitude of contrition and a willingness to change their behavior, to have their citation dismissed. The program consists of two classes, community service work, writing an essay, and paying a fee. One class is presented by an ex-convict who speaks about his life, his choices, and the consequences of them. The second class covers drug and alcohol awareness, self-responsibility, and identifying something in their lives to get involved in. Officer Rooney also is responsible for referring cases to the Children's Court Center or other agencies, preparing all juvenile cases for filing, maintaining juvenile files, and investigating serious juvenile offenses that occur outside the schools. Officer Rooney also works out of the Detective Bureau as an investigator and evidence technician for criminal investigations, as well as a Circuit Court liaison officer.

Officer Michael Lesnik served as the School Liaison Officer at the Brown Deer Middle School. Officer Lesnik is responsible for investigating criminal complaints as well as ordinance violations within the Brown Deer School District. Officer Lesnik is also responsible for teaching the D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) curriculum to the fifth grade students at the Brown Deer Middle School. Officer Lesnik taught about 125 D.A.R.E. students during the year and organized a graduation for the students in May. Officer Lesnik and Officer Fus also attended all home boys' varsity football and basketball games as well as prom and homecoming dances. Officer Lesnik was involved in the Wisconsin WINS tobacco compliance checks at area businesses. These checks ensure that local businesses do not sell tobacco to minors, and checks were completed twice during the year. Officer Lesnik also works out of the Detective Bureau as an investigator and evidence technician for criminal investigations, as well as a Circuit Court liaison Officer.

Officer Melissa Fus served as the School Liaison Officer at the Brown Deer High School. Officer Fus is responsible for investigating criminal complaints as well as ordinance violations within the Brown Deer School District. At the beginning of the school year, Officer Fus attended the Freshman Orientation Night and also the New Parent Orientation Night at the High School. Officer Fus, with the cooperation of several agencies, participated in and presented the Forever Changed program at Brown Deer High School which coincided with the 2009 Homecoming events. This program dramatized the effects of driving under the influence of alcohol or other drugs and also the possible consequences of texting while driving. The program used actual emergency responders, emergency equipment and student actors to bring a drunken driving crash to "life". Officer Fus also prepared and presented a Sexting/Cyberbullying presentation to the Freshman Health Class. Officer Fus works out of the Detective Bureau as an investigator and evidence technician for criminal investigations, as well as a Circuit Court liaison

officer. Officer Fus is a member of the WI School Resource Officer's Association and the National School Resource Officer's Association.

K-9 UNIT



BROWN DEER POLICE DEPARTMENT K-9 UNIT

In October 2004, Officer Daniel J. Hansen was sent to North Carolina to Southern Police Canine to begin the bonding and training process with the Brown Deer Police Department's fifth K-9, a Dutch Shepard imported from Holland, named Justis. For six weeks Officer Hansen and Justis trained together day and night in Narcotics Detection, Criminal Apprehension, Officer Protection, Evidence Retrieval and Tracking.

In June 2008, Officer Hansen was unable to continue performing the duties of a canine handler due to injury. Officer Brad T. Caddock was selected and was sent to Southern Police Canine in North Carolina to train and bond with Justis for six weeks. Justis continues to be fluent in all the aspects he was originally trained in.

Justis lives year round with the handler at his residence and rides to and from work with him. Justis only gets four cups of food a day and does not receive any type of human food or dog treats. Justis does not play with Frisbees, tennis balls or any other animal toys or other dogs; Justis is strictly a work tool for the Village of Brown Deer. Justis works for and is rewarded when he locates the odor of a controlled substance and the human scent of a fleeing or hidden suspect.

K-9 ACTIVITY FOR THE YEAR 2009:

Officer Hansen and Justis started to work the streets together on November 24, 2004 until June 2008. Officer Caddock and Justis have been in service since November 17, 2008.
