Activity Report:

During the month of May the Brown Deer Police Department responded to 1407 calls for service, issued 544 traffic citations, 109 parking citations and made 61 non-traffic related arrests/citations. Overall activity level was significantly higher when compared with the prior year.


Chief's Report

One of the Department goals for 2016 is to reduce the number of injury related traffic crashes to 2014 levels. In support of this goal each shift has been conducting High Visibility Traffic Enforcement details. These details last about one hour and concentrate on areas where higher than normal traffic crashes have occurred. This month the Department conducted seven details with the following results: 62 stops, 60 citations, 35 warnings and four arrests. This month only one traffic crash resulted in an injury compared to seven in 2015 and seven in 2014.


SLO Guenette organized a DARE graduation and pizza party. Pictures of the event were posted on the Department's social media sites.

All sworn personnel completed Rescue Task Force (RTF) training and participated in a joint training exercise with the North Shore Fire Department and other North Shore Police Departments. RTF is being implemented throughout Milwaukee County and is designed to get medical first responders into an active crisis site as soon as practical.


2015/2016 Year to Date Calls for Service




2015/2016 Year to Date Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)




**Reported Crime Comparison

Year to Date**




Thefts – Includes Retail Thefts which account for approximately 55% of the total theft complaints.


North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction

The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Liaison Officer (SLO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SLO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SLO Presence – Time the officer was physically present in the school (includes time instructing DARE).

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.
