Activity Report:

During the month of November the Brown Deer Police Department responded to 1207 calls for service, issued 340 traffic citations, 77 parking citations and made 46 non-traffic related arrests/citations. Overall activity level was significantly higher when compared with the prior year.


Chief's Report



The Department's "Shop with a Hero" event is scheduled for December 14th and will be held at Walmart.


2015/2016 Year to Date Calls for Service




2015/2016 Year to Date Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)




**Reported Crime Comparison

Year to Date**




November 2016 Allocation of Police Services


Thefts – Includes Retail Thefts which account for approximately 55% of the total theft complaints.


North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction

The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Liaison Officer (SLO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SLO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SLO Presence – Time the officer was physically present in the school.

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.
