## Public Information Meeting regarding WIS 57 & 100 Intersection!

**Final Chance to voice your opinion on July 30th for the next 50 years!** Village of Brown Deer residents, public officials, business owners and other stake holders are opposed to the WI DOT's plan to rebuild the N. Green Bay Rd. and W. Brown Deer Rd. interchange and prefer the intersection "at-grade". Why the at-grade intersection is preferred: Aesthetics, Access/Economic Development, Cost, Connectivity, and Quality of Life.

The Public Informational meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 30th from 4:00-6:00pm at the Lois and Tom Dolan Community Center, located at 4355 West Bradley Road.



## DID YOU HEAR...?

⇒ The Administration Department will continue to process tax payments until July 31, 2014 at which time any delinquent will be turned over to Milwaukee County.

⇒ The Goodwill Development Agreement was passed Monday night. The Public Works Director completed a review of the stormwater management plan (SWMP) for the new Goodwill store project. The new Goodwill store is proposed at the Hearthside site which is located in the NW quadrant of W. Schroeder Drive and N. Green Bay Avenue. The SWMP is reviewed to ensure the site is in compliance with Village, WDNR, and MMSD rules & regulations related to stormwater runoff control for both quantity & quality.

⇒ The Engineering Manager compiled the required documents to submit to the State for the next two stormwater management projects to be constructed in the Village in 2015. Each grant is a matching grant of up to \$150,000, meaning for every qualifying dollar the Village spends it is reimbursed by the State. Any costs beyond \$300,000 are the responsibility of the Village. This rarely happens, as projects are selected by the Village to meet those parameters.

## ON THE BDPD BEAT:

 Village Manager, Michael Hall, is pleased to announce the selection of Michael Kass as the Village's new Police Chief. Chief Kass was most recently the Chief of Police in Sparta, WI. Chief Kass has over 25 years of law enforcement experience of which he has 20 years in supervisory and management positions. Chief Kass has been very active in the communities he's served, and will start August 4th. Please welcome him into the Brown Deer Community!

## ANNUAL "BIG FLUSH" SCHEDULED

The Brown Deer Water Utility will begin its annual "Big Flush" of the water system started on July 15th, and lasts 3-4 weeks. The process begins at the water system supply points and moves water through the pipes to the extremities of the system. The goal is to remove any mineral sediment that builds up in the pipes, improve water quality, and maintain the valves and hydrants in the system. The flushing does cause a temporary stirring of sediments. Some suggestions to make the "Big Flush" go smoothly:



- Watch for the signs! We will post signs along the entry roads to the neighborhood being flushed on any given day.
- The day we are in your neighborhood, refrain from doing laundry if possible (sediment can damage clothes & wash machines) & wait for the water to clear before using for drinking or cooking.
- The days following are a good time for you to "spring clean" your plumbing. Run water from all faucets for about 5 minutes while flushing all toilets. While this seems like a lot of water, it is a good practice to remove any loose sediment buildup in your own plumbing. The cost of a 5 minute flush is less than 15 cents.
- After flushing your plumbing, remove faucet screens and clean out any sediment that collects.
