Partisan Office Election on August 12, 2014

Reconstruction Project on County Line Road

The W. County Line Road reconstruction project is underway. The contractor has completed the driveway culvert installations and is currently working on hydrant relocations. Expected work next week is continuation of the hydrant relocations along with the roadway widening to accommodate the 4-ft paved shoulders and 2-ft gravel shoulders adjacent to the 11-ft travel lanes. The project completion date is tentatively September 30th. The roadway is CLOSED to thru traffic and open to local traffic and businesses only. Please drive with caution when using W. County Line Road as the area is an active construction zone. The contractor and workers appreciate drivers using caution to ensure their safety.

Zoning Code Enforcement ramping up Patrol

As of July 21st, 2014, the Zoning & Planning Specialist has recorded 210 code violations into the BS&A municipal database system. Roughly 125 of these violations have been resolved. This week one abandoned vehicle was towed. Another owner was given a final notice regarding their nuisance vehicle as well. Two residential parcels were referred to a lawn service for failure to comply with Village codes regarding lawn maintenance.

- ⇒ Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) treatments are continuing throughout the Village. An ash tree suspected to have EAB infection was removed from N Maura Lane. Treatments will continue throughout the summer along Village roadways with a heavy ash tree population.
- ⇒ Public Works has received notice of the State road salt bid for the 2014-15 winter seasons. The price per ton will be \$60.36 this year, a 15% increase over last season.

Weekly Health Tip

Some types of blue-green algae, also known as pond-scum, can be toxic and should be avoided. Some of the toxins can cause illness and even death in humans and animals. It's hard to know which are toxic so it's better to avoid all algae. If exposure occurs, rinse off immediately with soap and water. Be alert for symptoms such as skin rashes or trouble breathing and call for help if these occur.
