W. COUNTY LINE ROAD RECONSTRUCTION:

The W. County Line Road reconstruction project continues. The contractor, Payne & Dolan, Inc., is working on "fine" grading the roadway gravel surface prior to paving occurring. The first lift of asphalt (binder course) is expected to be paved next week, the week of October 6th. After the asphalt binder course is paved the off-roadway finishing items along with manhole and water valve box adjustments can be completed. The project substantial completion date has shifted out to October 15th due to the contractor's schedule.



W. DEAN ROAD RECONSTRUCTION:

The W. Dean Road reconstruction project is moving along. The contractor, Baumhardt Sand & Gravel, has completed all of the underground storm sewer replacement work. Current work includes re-ditching, sidewalk preparation, and new concrete curb & gutter preparation and is occurring mainly on the far east end of the project at the N. Teutonia Ave/CTH D limit. Future work includes sidewalk base aggregate preparation, concrete sidewalk installation, and new concrete curb & gutter preparation/installation which will all be completed by a separate contractor, Zenith Tech, Inc. The project limits are from N. 55th St east to N. Teutonia Ave (CTH D). The project will replace the deteriorating asphalt pavement and include 4-ft paved shoulders dueling as on-street bike lanes. A new concrete sidewalk will also be added along the north side of Dean Rd within the service drive terrace area which is being funded 100% through the Wisconsin Dept of Transportation (WisDOT) Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant. Driveway culverts, drive approach paving, and re-ditching will also occur as part of the project. The estimated project completion date is October 30th.

As a reminder, both roadways are **CLOSED** to thru traffic and open to local traffic and businesses only. Please drive with caution as the areas are active construction zones.



TREE-TRIMMING: DPW crews are marking trees for trimming. Additionally, Asplundh, contractor for WE-Energies, has started trimming trees adjacent to power lines on the north side of W. Bradley Road between N. 51st Street and N. 60th Street.

ROADWAY RE-PAVING PROGRAM:

DPW crews are continuing the re-ditching and replacing select driveway culverts throughout the W. Carolann Drive & W. Glenbrook Road neighborhoods. Crews have finished the roadway cross culvert replacements along with all re-ditching & driveway culvert replacements in the N. 57th St, N. 58th Street, W. Ester Place, and W. Range Avenue neighborhood.
