

Department of Public Works

GENERAL: The W. Bradley Road reconstruction project plans and specifications are AVAILABLE TO PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS.

The project limits are between N. 51st Street. and N. Sherman Blvd/CTH G. The expected start date is April 2015 with a completion date in July 2015.

The BID OPENING is on Thursday, January 22nd at 10:00am.

SANITARY SEWER: The Sanitary Sewer Technician & Administrative Assistant uploaded photos and documents for the sale of the old sewer jet/vac unit on the Wisconsin Surplus website. The Village purchased a new sewer jetter in the spring of 2014 which replaced the existing unit and dissolved the relationship with the City of Glendale who the Village previously shared the equipment with. Proceeds from the sale of the existing unit will be split 50/50 between the Village of Brown Deer and the City of Glendale.

The Sanitary Sewer Technician performed an inspection on the interior of the Village's lift station located in the SW quadrant of W. County Line Road & N. 67th Street. Several maintenance repairs were noted which will be included in future capital project planning.

North Shore Health Department

The North Shore Health Department has seen a significant increase of influenza hospitalizations. Please remember these simple **prevention techniques** to help reduce the spread to others:

- **Wash your hands** often with soap and water; use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer when water is not available.
- **Cover your cough or sneeze with your upper sleeve**, and try to avoid touching your face with your hands. If you use a tissue, throw it away after one use, and wash your hands.
- Avoid being exposed to people who are sick with flu-like symptoms. **Stay home when you are sick!**
- **Eat nutritious meals, get plenty of rest.**
- **Frequently clean commonly touched surfaces** (e.g., door knobs, refrigerator handle, telephone, faucets).
- **If you think you have the flu**, stay home, get rest, drink plenty of liquids and avoid using alcohol and tobacco.
- It is also being recommended that you **contact your physician** for a prescription of Tamiflu within 48 hours of symptom onset. Tamiflu is an antiviral medication that may lessen the severity of symptoms if started within the first 48 hours.

Prevention Works

Community Development Department

- A public open house will be held at the Lois & Tom Dolan Community Center on January 20th, from 5:00-7:00pm, to gather feedback and input on the Village's Draft **Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan. The draft Plan, known as the "CORP"**, is intended to help guide the acquisition, preservation, and development of land for parks, recreation trails, and other open spaces to meet the needs of Brown Deer's residents and visitors. **The draft Plan is available online at www.browndeerwi.org** and will be presented for review. A short presentation on the plan will be offered at the open house.
- The Community Development Director met with representatives of RK Development who have submitted plans for a new **multi-tenant retail building** at the vacant land north of Fox 6 studios. At this time **Office Depot is scheduled to anchor the development.** Previously a Dunkin Donuts was proposed for the site.
- Staff continues to work with CDA counsel to determine possible amendments to **Tax Incremental Financing (TIF) District #2** and/or the creation of a new District. Staff was directed to pursue this effort given the recent acquisition of the Lighthouse property and the possible long term redevelopment of the former Algonquin School site. Both of the parcels are immediately adjacent of the existing TIF District #2.
