

Community Development Department

Construction continues at the **new Lighthouse of Brown Deer** location immediately north and west of the intersection of 60th and Brown Deer Road. The construction team lead by Design2Construct has excavating for foundation and the reconfiguration of utilities. Progress has been slow and steady as crews deal with frost conditions. The construction timetable to grand opening is still roughly 14 months



The Community Development Director, Village Manager and Village Attorney met with two different parties interested in reusing and **redeveloping the former American TV building** and property or a portion thereof. Interest in the site has increased recently and Staff is hopeful that a new user(s) can be identified shortly. Any new

use for the site would require Village Plan Commission and Board review and approval due to recent changes to the site zoning to help provide the Village with more control of the land use.

Community Services Staff met with residents of **Warwick Court, the Village's only private road** for single family residential homes, to discuss options for the replacement of the road. The road is in extremely poor condition and all parties recognize that major repair is required. Staff outlined the estimated costs for reconstruction and options for how the roadway could be dedicated back to the Village as public right of way.

Department of Public Works

GENERAL: The W. Bradley Road construction contract was approved and awarded to Vinton Construction of Manitowoc, WI. The project limits are from N. 51st Street to N. Sherman Blvd/CTH G. The project will replace the deteriorating concrete pavement and remove the center two-way-left-turn lane. A new bio-retention median will be installed along with new storm sewer infrastructure, concrete curb & gutter, and asphalt pavement. Also as part of the project the N. 50th drainage-way will be naturalized. The expected start date is April 1st with a completion date in July 2015.

Winter Operations: DPW crews were busy with winter operations activities very early on Monday, February 16th morning. A lake effect snow event started during the afternoon hours and into late evening on Sunday, February 15th. DPW crews started a salting operation at 4:00am on Monday with work finishing at 7:00am ahead of the morning rush-hour.



Refuse and Recycling: DPW crews are working on switching out old and outdated refuse carts throughout the Village and completing repairs on damaged carts. DPW replaces outdated carts annually with the new standard black 96-gallon refuse carts. Records are updated as cart replacement is completed.


