Activity Report:

During the month of January the Brown Deer Police Department responded to 1266 calls for service, issued 459 traffic citations, 105 parking citations and made 146 non-traffic related arrests/citations. Overall activity level was similar when compared with the prior year.

Chief's Report

The Department initiated a sexual assault investigation after a school official learned of inappropriate sexual contact between students that occurred over the Christmas break. This resulted in four middle school students being referred to Milwaukee County Children Services on sexual assault charges. The investigation was widely reported amongst local news affiliates and received some national attention, partially attributed to a news headline in the North Shore Now where it was referred to as a sex party.


We continue to investigate the cause of a car fire that occurred in the 9100 block of Goldendale Dr. One vehicle started on fire which in turn started another vehicle parked behind it on fire.

Officers continue to investigate a robbery that occurred at Bath and Body Works; an unidentified suspect was confronted by an employee after leaving the store with unpaid merchandise. The suspect then used pepper spray on the employee and fled the area in a vehicle.



Walmart Store Manager Jason Radliff was recognized for supporting our 2014 "Shop With A Cop" program.


2014/2015 Year to Date Calls for Service




2014/2015 Year to Date Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)

January 2014/2015**




January 2015 Allocation of Police Services




General Calls for Service – Complaints that typically do not require a police report and/or those that occur infrequently enough that they can't be assigned to one of the listed categories. Examples would be disabled vehicles, death investigations, code violations, etc.

Thefts – Includes Retail Thefts which account for approximately 55% of the total theft complaints.

The Department has two Investigators that also serve as School Liaison Officers (SLO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SLO's spend performing the various duties assigned to them.
