

Community Development Department

- The CD Director & Village Mgr. met with the School District Finance & Facilities committee to discuss the possibility of jointly listing the former Algonquin School property & the former Lighthouse property for sale under a common broker. The proposed broker is RFP Commercial who is also listing the Bradley West Shopping Center for sale. Recently the Village expanded TIF District #2 to include these properties & to provide a mechanism to promote development in the neighborhood. The brokerage proposal from RFP will be discussed by the Village Board & School Boards at upcoming meetings.



- As the winter fades and the grass begins to grow the Zoning and Planning Specialist has begun to identify an increasing number of properties with unkempt lawns and debris in yards. Recently a couple of yards which were in severe condition required the use of outside waste haulers to clean the property after repeated notices and citations failed to correct the issues. As a reminder, grass must be kept to a height of less than 8 inches and the exterior storage of junk, refuse and debris is prohibited by Village ordinance. North Shore Health Department

- The North Shore Health Department is part of Southeastern Wisconsin's Cities Readiness Initiative (CRI). This CDC-funded Initiative was established to bring together state and local public health departments, along with healthcare organizations, to develop plans to respond to a large-scale bioterrorist event by dispensing antibiotics to the entire population within 48 hours.
- Using car seats, swings, bouncers and other carrying devices as sleeping places for infants puts them at risk for injury or death. Infants and young children should not be left unsupervised [awake or asleep] when using a sitting or carrying device due to the risk of suffocation and death." 

Weekly Health Tip


May is the National Blood Pressure Education Month.

Village Feasibility Study – Step Two

Our second meeting with Bray Architects took place on Monday, May 11, 2015. An in-depth tour of the Village Hall/Police Department (4800 West Green Brook Drive), the Department of Public Works (8717 North 43rd Street), the Brown Deer Public Library (5600 West Bradley Road) and the Police Department's shooting range was conducted with staff and Bray associates.

The main purpose of this tour of the facilities was to collect detailed information about each property. This information will help us determine the areas that are still functional and the areas that will need improvements. We also looked at the current and future maintenance needs of the facilities.

On our excursion through the properties, the Bray engineers were looking at various aspects of each building. These engineers included: Dan, an Electrical Engineer from Maurmann Engineering; Tim, a Plumbing Engineer from Maurmann Engineering; Randy, a Mechanical Engineer from Fredericksen Engineering; as well as Michael, the Architectural Engineer from Bray Architects who has been the lead person for this study. The amount of notes taken and questions asked showed there is a great deal of dedication to understanding every inch of these structures, as well as complementing some of the more recent work we have had done, i.e., the updated village board/court room!

The final report should be available in the fall of 2015. This detailed analysis will help the Village budget and plan for future costs. Once the report has been reviewed by the members of the Steering Committee and the Village Board, a decision will be made on what direction we will be taking and where we are going with this information.
