
Sanitary Sewer: The Sanitary Sewer Technician is working on cleaning (jetting) sewer mains throughout the Village this week as per the Village's wastewater discharge permit with the WDNR. The Village operates approximately 45-miles of sanitary sewer & routine cleaning is critical to prevent blockages which lead to basement back-ups. The Sanitary Sewer Technician continues marking-out all of the sanitary sewer lateral pipes along the N. 60th St. corridor between W. Fairy Chasm Road and W. County Line Road.

Community Development Department

- The Community Development Director prepared documentation including a Certified Survey Map and purchase agreements with Aldi Wisconsin and PAK Technologies for the former American TV site. The Village Board reviewed and approved the offers to purchase at their meeting on Monday May 4th, however all land use reviews and approvals are still required. The existing parcel is being divided into 3 separate lots: a 6.6 acre parcel to the north that includes the former American building for PAK Technologies, a 2.2. acre outlot for Aldi and the Village will retain a 1.2 acre parcel for flood and stormwater management.
- The Community Development Director and Village Manager met with real estate agents from RFP Commercial to discuss brokerage opportunities for Village and School District Land on N. 47th Street south of W. Bradley Road. RFP currently lists the Bradley West shopping center for sale and there may be opportunities to combine redevelopment efforts on this parcel along with the land to the south. Staff of the Village and School District will continue to explore this opportunity and report back to Village and School Boards.

North Shore Health Department

- Staff checked blood pressures and had radon kits available at the Healthy & Safe Saturday in Shorewood. The event was hosted by the Shorewood Police Dept. and the North Shore Fire Dept. Reduced cost radon kits are still available at either Health Department office.
- The North Shore Health Department has received a beach water grant which will help assure safe water conditions at Atwater, Klode and Doctor's Park beaches. Staff will be doing routine water testing for harmful levels of bacteria & communicating water safety to the public.
- The health officer and a public health nurse attended a press conference at Ferch's Malt Shoppe for a ribbon-cutting ceremony at the County's first Memory Cafe.
- A public health nurse attended the Shorewood Dementia Awareness Work Group. The work group works towards increasing Alzheimer's awareness and other types of dementias and to promote available resources to people with the disease and their care partners. Part of the plan is to inform, educate, and involve the communities in a comprehensive way.
