NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

On Tuesday, December 1, 2015 both offices of the North Shore Health Department will be closed. Staff will be off-site for an all-day strategic planning retreat.

The NS Health Dept.'s **Director/Health Officer, Ann Christiansen** completed the WI Assoc. of Local Health Depts. & Boards' New Health Officer Training. This 3 part series provided an orientation on public health law & statutes, advocacy, achieving national accreditation, workforce develop., & service areas such as enviro. health, comm./chronic disease, & public health preparedness.

Kathy Platt, Nurse Supervisor, was invited to participate on the Board for Respite Care Association of Wisconsin. In this role, Ms. Platt will further the health department's role in optimizing health and quality of life for residents with disabilities and special needs and their caregivers.

SUCCESS STORY!!!

The health department worked with several families in the North Shore to reduce their blood lead levels. The health department receives results from all children in the North Shore who have a blood lead test. We follow-up on children whose test results are at or above 5 µg/dL. Recently, we received reports of several kids with lead levels over or near 10 µg/dL. We offered our HEPA vacuum to these families, conducted home visits to identify potential sources of exposure, and then counseled on a variety of prevention strategies. Some of these included wet mopping, wiping floors, windows and making sure kids have foods rich in iron and calcium. After several months working with the families of these children, follow-up testing showed that their lead levels were down to less than 5 µg/dL.

The Health Dept. provides flu shots to homebound residents. If you are homebound or know someone who is, please contact the health department at 414-371-2980 to schedule an appointment.

Saturdays from 10am to 5pm.


