Come play & build with Legos! The club is open to anyone who is old enough to play with Legos by themselves.



Adult Card Program: Wed., Jan 27th - 6:00-7:00pm

One of the health department's health improvement priority areas is mental health. To support our work in this area, health department staff are actively involved with REDGen and continue to serve on REDGen's Leadership Committee. REDGen is a group whose work is focused on promoting balance and resiliency for kids and families in the North Shore. Health dept. staff provided a key informant interview for the **Shorewood Senior Resource Center** to help guide the development of the center's strategic plan.

Staff also participated on a workgroup hosted by the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Zilber School of Public Health.
