NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Lead is a naturally-occurring toxic metal. Lead poisoning has been linked to delays in both mental & physical development. Children under the age of six are particularly vulnerable to elevated lead levels. The amount of lead in manufactured materials has been reduced in recent years due to health concerns, though it can still be found in a wide variety of products in/around our homes, incl. paint, ceramics, pipes & plumbing materials, solders, gasoline, batteries, ammunition, & cosmetics. Although lead rarely occurs naturally in water, if internal pipes contain lead, it can leach into water if the water is not treated correctly.

The NS communities regularly test tap water for lead and the results are consistently below the EPA's action level of 15 ppb (parts per billion). The treatment plants that supply water to NS communities add corrosion control treatment to the drinking water. The treatment is designed to coat the interior of the pipes to help prevent the leaching of lead into the drinking water. There are several simple ways to decrease the lead in residential water:

- Flush your plumbing by running cold water for three minutes
- Only use cold water for cooking
- Purchase a home filtration system
- Contact a certified plumber who can:
 - 1) Tell you if your home has a lead service line;
 - 2) Check for lead solders in your home's internal pipes; and
 - 3) Look for fixtures containing lead.

If you have concerns about lead in your drinking water & want to test your water, contact the State Lab of Hygiene for a specific test kit. Residents can order the sample kit by calling (800) 442-4618.



- A risk to anyone traveling to a region of the world where Zika virus is found.




Global risk

Outbreaks have occurred in parts of Africa, Southeast Asia, and the Pacific Islands. In May 2015, Brazil reported the first outbreak of Zika virus in the Americas.

Zika virus is not currently found in the United States. However, cases of Zika have been previously reported in returning travelers.
