

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

- The Zoning and Planning Specialist inspected two dozen properties reported vacant to confirm their vacancy and code compliance, as part of the effort to roll out enforcement of the new Vacant Property Registration Ordinance.
- The Zoning and Planning Specialist issued a final written warning to the owners and operators of the businesses at 4685 W. Bradley Rd., in regards to consistent and ongoing failure to adhere to at least three parts of the developer agreement for this property. Failure to respond to this final, written notice may result in the scheduling of a public hearing to revoke the conditional use permit for this property.
- The Lighthouse project is shooting for a June 4th occupancy.
- A new Chinese takeout business has contacted building inspection about plans to fill a portion of the former Shop on Sherman space. Building space designs are being investigated.
- A new single family residence has begun construction on 9067 Brandybrook Trail (Lot 30).

**Celebrate
"Bike to School Day"
on May 4th**

Bicycling to school helps students reach the recommended goal of 60 minutes of physical activity every day. Students also arrive at school energized & ready to learn. To improve the health of our children and community, encourage walking & bicycling to school!



NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

- The Public Health Manager attended the National Association of City and County Health Officers' Preparedness Summit in Dallas, TX. In addition to attending sessions on topics such as Zika, active shooters and food system contamination, she also participated in a one-day pre-Summit mentoring program for new emergency preparedness coordinators called "Roadmap to Ready." Since 2002, state and local health departments, as well as Fire, Police and Emergency Management, have been tasked by the Federal government with portions of emergency preparedness for their communities.



The North Shore Health Department has twice been recognized as "Project Public Health Ready" for our ability to plan for, respond to, and recover from public health emergencies. We continue to update, improve, and exercise our preparedness plans to keep residents of the North Shore safe in emergencies or disasters.

- North Shore Health Department leaders participated in a Regional Ebola Virus Table Top Exercise with partners from around this region. These included all health departments in southeast Wisconsin, the Milwaukee Fire Department, Froedtert Hospital, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, and the Region 7 Healthcare Emergency Readiness Coalition, and many others. The purpose of the exercise was to evaluate current response concepts, plans and capabilities in response to a possible outbreak of a viral disease like Ebola or other diseases with high mortality.
- The Health Director/Officer presented to the North Shore Fire/Rescue Board of Directors key accomplishments from 2015 and objectives for 2016 in anticipation of the release of the Health Department's 2015 Annual Report.
- The North Shore Health Department, in partnership with Safe Kids of Southeastern Wisconsin and the North Shore Fire/Rescue collected over 170 child car seats for recycling this past Saturday at Fire Station 81 in Brown Deer.
- Health Department staff continues to work with REDgen to promote balance and resiliency in the lives of our youth and families. REDgen is non-profit coalition with community members such as school leaders, faith community leaders and health care providers. Their goal is to develop a new generation of resilient young people with a healthy understanding of what success means.
- Health Department staff attended a SafeKids meeting and presented information on dog bite prevention. As the weather warms up, everyone is anxious to get out for nice long walks around the neighborhood again. It is important to be aware of dogs approaching, whether you are walking on the sidewalk, biking on the street or working in your yard.
