COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT



The Zoning & Planning Specialist has begun coordinating code enforcement efforts with Officer Benway, to address Village code violations at several vacant residential and commercial properties throughout the Village. Specifically, they are working to streamline the response to grass complaints which spike at this time of the year.

The Development Director attended a Public Information meeting regarding the Hwy 57/100 intersection at the Lois and Tom Dolan Community center. The information meeting was organized by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DOT) to gain feedback on three intersection designs along with the larger Hwy 57 repaving project. Comments are being accepted by the DOT until May 31st. Information from the meeting is available on the Public Works department page on the village website.


Weekly Health Tips

Stay safe this summer!

Don't let the sunny days & warm nights fool you. Heat can stress the human body. Body temperature can rise when the body heats too rapidly to cool itself properly or when too much fluid or salt is lost through dehydration or sweating.

This can lead to serious health conditions such as heat exhaustion, heat stroke or even death.

NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT



The week before Memorial Day, May 23–29, 2016, marks the 12th annual Healthy & Safe Swimming Week. Swim safety is very important to prevent injuries or even drowning. Along with injury prevention it is important to be aware of recreational water illnesses (RWIs). RWIs are caused by germs spread by swallowing, breathing in mists or aerosols, or having contact with contaminated water in swimming pools, hot tubs, water parks, water play areas, interactive fountains, lakes, rivers, or oceans. Diarrhea is the most common RWI, and it is often caused by germs like *Cryptosporidium*, *Giardia*, norovirus, *Shigella*, and *E. coli*.

Protect yourself from swim related injuries and water illnesses by following these steps:

- **Check yourself! Keep the pee, poop, sweat, blood, and dirt out of the water. Make sure you shower even for just one minute prior to swimming**
- **Stay out of the water if you have diarrhea or an open wound**
- **Make sure a lifeguard is on duty**
- **Protect yourself by using sunscreen with at least SPF 15**

The North Shore Health Department assures safe water conditions for wading or swimming at Atwater, Klode and Doctor's Park beaches by routinely testing water for harmful levels of bacteria and posting signs to communicate water safety to the public during summer swimming season.
