

Recently submitted grants through the Community Block Grant Development program for the following projects: Senior Citizens Club, Re-pave Multi-Use trail from the Oak Leaf Trail to Deerbrook Trail, and an ADA accessible shelter at the new Badger Meter River Park.

COMMUNITY SERVICE OFFICE

The Zoning & Planning Specialist processed vacant property registration applications for three properties this week. Since enactment of Ordinance 15-2, the Community Services Department has identified 99 properties that do or may require registration and inspection, and has registered 24 commercial and residential properties. The Zoning & Planning Specialist also responded to complaints regarding illegal signage at two commercial sites, and failure to conform to landscaping, parking, and noise provisions of Conditional Use permits at three other commercial properties.

The Paradox of Being a Black Police

Officer in Today's Society

Presented by Corey Saffold

Officer Corey Saffold is a law enforcement professional in Madison, and is known in the community for his volunteerism and his work with youth of all ages and demographic backgrounds. In addition to his service throughout the city of Madison, Officer Saffold is entrusted by his superiors to do the sensitive work of policing in one of the city's larger public high schools as a School Liaison Officer. In his talk, Corey will discuss his experiences as a Black policeman in the wake of multiple, highly publicized killings of unarmed African-Americans by police officers. Additionally, Officer Saffold will address the paradox of being a Black officer during a time when police are viewed as an enemy and are often not trusted, especially among the African-American community. The shooting and killing of unarmed African-Americans has intensified already strained relations between the community and the police. As such, Officer Saffold will offer his strategy for engaging the community at large around these issues that have also affected him personally. Corey will relay his personal experiences with law enforcement and how these experiences have helped to shape his approach to upholding the law throughout the city.

Weekly Health Tips

While most of us don't spend much time thinking about our colon, it plays a vital role in our health, balance, and energy levels. Everything we ingest, is eventually processed in our colon, which is exposed to all the indigestible toxins that are left after we have absorbed everything that is nourishing. After many years of exposure, these toxins can contribute to the development of various digestive illnesses, including colon cancer.

For this reason, medical experts recommend that anyone who is 50 or older receive regular colorectal cancer screening. A colonoscopy is an extremely effective test that can detect a cancer in its early stages, before it begins to spread. The benefits of the test far outweigh the temporary discomfort of the screening.



Did You Know?

If you or a loved one have diabetes, you already know how important it is to develop a routine of checking your blood sugar. However, when temperatures rise in the summer and storms pop up, that routine may be disrupted, making it harder to keep diabetes managed. The National Diabetes Education Program (NDEP) has resources to help you prepare and manage your diabetes during difficult times.

Some tips provided by NDEP include:

- Know local emergency resources, including fire, police, and hospitals in the area.
- Create a plan to communicate with family and friends. Include multiple ways to make that connection, such as home phone and cell phone numbers and email addresses. Be sure to include far-away relatives or friends.
- Build a supply kit that has enough supplies for 2 weeks. Check these supplies at least every 2 – 3 months, watch for expiration dates, and know the storage requirements (such as temperature and light) for those supplies.
- Know the options for care when you cannot get diabetes supplies, or run out.
- Understand how stresses, such as that caused by weather extremes, can affect blood sugar.
- Always wear diabetes identification bands/jewelry.

Important Reminder

Bats can carry and transmit rabies. The only way to determine if a bat is rabid is to have it tested at the State Lab of Hygiene. If you have a bat in your home, *do not* release it, and *do not* kill it. Instead trap it, and call the Wildlife Rehabilitation Center at the Wisconsin Humane Society (414-431-6204) as well as the North Shore Health Department (414-371-2980) for guidance. Last week at the North Shore Health Department

Staff attended the 42nd Annual Governor's Conference on Highway Safety and participated in the Community Car Seat Check Event in Green Bay where 63 car seats were checked in 3 hours. Over two days, attendees learned about 6 different car seat brands, including new technology, what makes them unique, safety features, and proper use. Updates were also given on best practices and the most recent research on crash testing.

Nursing staff and the Health Officer participated in the annual training required for enrollment as a provider for the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program, which provides subsidized vaccinations for children without vaccine insurance coverage. The North Shore Health Department will continue as a VFC program provider; call 371-2980 if you have questions regarding eligibility or to make an appointment.

Staff attended the Whitefish Bay Farmers' Market where information on lead exposure was provided.
