

BDNW Meeting Minutes for Wednesday, September 20th, 2017.

The meeting was called to order by our President Dale Gass, at 7:00 p.m. in the court room of the Brown Deer Village Hall. Twenty-five members were in attendance.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dale Gass asked some interesting Brown Deer Trivia questions about village zip codes, village voting precincts, wards, and polling places, Brown Deer Magazine, and Dog Swim in the village pond.

Alice Mueller gave a treasurer's report of \$645.76.

Dale Gass led a discussion on the following topics:

- We had 33 people sign up for our group at the outdoor events held this summer.
- A great big thank you to all of the volunteers that helped staff the BDNW booth at these events. A special thank you to Jim Farmer and Rob Guilbert who volunteered at multiple events as well as others who called and left messages that they were available to help out!
- We now have 195 people on our email distribution list, and 70 people on our hard copy distribution list. Thanks to the BDPD for sending out the hardcopy communications.
- We've made \$260 in profits so far on sales of yard signs, lapel pins, and wrist bands.
- Remember that all profits will be split evenly between the BDPD and the BDNW group.
- We've sold 60 yard signs so far, and 40 more are available for sale. Get yours now! \$15 each.
- Reminder that we have additional items for sale to support our group and the police department. (American/LE Memorial Flag and K9 paw print Lapel pins, and thin blue line wrist bands, all for \$4 each.)
- At our next meeting in November will have elections for our officer positions. Please attend.
- We have an immediate opening for the Secretary position. Volunteers/nominations needed.
- A discussion was had about theft from cars, and theft of cars being a continuing problem for the village and neighboring communities. Please keep your cars locked up, as this still has been a very good deterrent. Many vehicles that were ransacked or taken were found to be unlocked, or running unattended.
- Also, if you park outside, it would be a good idea to take your remote garage door openers out of the vehicle(s). It has been reported in other communities that thieves are looking for these in cars parked outdoors and are then opening the main garage door to gain access to the house via an unlocked inside garage door. They then look for car keys and help themselves to anything else that looks valuable and sells easily. Then they load up your car with your valuables and take that too!
