GENERAL: Week ending November 20th is the last week for roadside yard waste collection. If you have yard waste after this week, please bring it to the Recycling Center located at 8950 N. Arbon Drive. Reminder that the Recycling Center is now automated and open 7-days a week from 7am to 7pm. The completed application can be dropped off at Village Hall in the 24-hour drop-box outside, e-mailed to DPW, or dropped off at the DPW office between 7am and 3:30pm.

The Director attended a pre-construction meeting for the F-Street development project at the old DPW site in the Original Village neighborhood. The development will be a multi-family apartment complex and include a “community square” south of Larry’s Market which will house the Farmer’s Market and a Community Building w/ Brew Pub. The project will occur throughout 2021.

The Village Board approved a contract for demolition of the former Glendale Clinic and a sewer lining project in the Bradley Estates subdivision. Both projects will start this fall and span into spring of 2021.

The Village’s engineering consultant completed a topographic survey along Beaver Creek between N. 68th Street and N. 64th Street as part of the planning process for the upcoming streambank stabilization project which will take place in the summer of 2021. DPW and the engineers are also completing a title search to ensure all easement documents are in-place.

WINTER OPERATIONS: The Mechanic continues outfitting trucks and equipment for winter operations. DPW is ready for the upcoming season!

A total of 4,400 gallons of calcium chloride was delivered to fill the tank for the upcoming winter season. The liquid was delivered to the DPW yard the week of November 2nd. Calcium Chloride is used as pre-wetting system with the road salt.

The 2020-2021 salt bid was received by WisDOT. The Village ordered 1,000-tons of guaranteed fill salt for the season with 200-tons of salt on reserve. This season’s price is \$73.32/ton (last season’s price was \$72.59). DPW has a reserve of 900-tons in the dome currently. We use on average 1,000 tons of salt per season.

The DPW crew was out marking their plow routes with delineator markers to help navigate curves/corners. The crew also passed-out deficient mailbox forms.

SANITARY SEWER: The Sanitary Sewer Technician is currently televising sewer lines in the Donges Woods subdivision.

STORMWATER: The DPW crew is cleaning out the stormwater drainage ditch north of Glendbrook Road from Carlotta to the drainage grate/pipe. The crew is also clearing brush from various other drainage grates before winter.

The street sweeper is running every day during the fall months on the curb and gutter roadways as per the Village's stormwater MS4 permit with the WDNR along with Village owned parking lots and porous asphalt.

The DPW crew is working on cleaning out the stormwater water quality proprietary devices. These structures collect debris/sediment from stormwater runoff prior to discharge into receiving waters (i.e. Beaver Creek & Southbranch Creek). The Village's consultant is testing the outfall pipes from these structures for Illicit Discharges.

REMINDER: All culvert replacements and driveway approach paving work requires a permit. Culvert replacements are completed in-house by DPW crews ahead of the residential driveway approach paving. Please contact the DPW office for more information.

BEAUTIFICATION/FORESTRY: The DPW crew is trimming bushes and completing fall clean-up in planter beds along Brown Deer Road and the roundabout on Teutonia & Bradley along with the Bradley Road bio-medians.

The DPW crew is mowing down the natural areas throughout the Village. The hardwood savannah on Teutonia and Sherman north of Bradley Road was mowed down week ending November 20th.

The Village crews mowed grass at the DPW, Library, Bradley Road and Badger Meter River Park. The Village's grass mowing contractor, Fox Services, completed a full median mowing and weekly mowing at Village Hall, Fairy Chasm, and the Library. **This was the last mowing of the season (2020).**

STREETS & TRAFFIC: Payne & Dolan completed some hot asphalt patching (1.5" overlay) on Bradley Road between N. Cedarburg Road & N. 37th Street the week of November 9th.

The Engineering Technician continues working on the 2020 roadway re-paving program bidding documents and streets list along with estimating the public improvements in the Original Village as part of the F-Street development project at the old DPW site. Public improvements include, but are not limited to, sidewalk addition on N. 43rd Street and angle on-street parking addition along Deerwood Drive south of Larry's to Peabody's/Wade Weissman.

The DPW crew is filling potholes as time allows.

REFUSE AND RECYCLING: Payne & Dolan completed asphalt paving at the stockpile site located in the NW quadrant of N. 55th Street & W. Beaver Creek Parkway. The DPW created a storage pad and bins for excess mulch from the Recycling Center. Paving occurred the week of November 9th.

The DPW crew was out picking litter in the public right-of-way the week of October 26th ahead of the weekly grass mowing. Special attention was given to the main highways (i.e. Brown Deer Road, Green Bay Road, Teutonia, and Sherman).

The DPW crew services the new Recycling Center each morning. The crew condenses all the bins and removes the brush from the brush pile area. Advanced Disposal changes out/empties all the 20-yd containers each day.

PARKS & RECREATION: The DPW crew repaired and painted damaged picnic tables in Village Park.

The DPW crew cut-out heaved asphalt at each basketball hoop pole at Fairy Chasm Park. Re-paving occurred the week of November 2nd.
