During the month of August, the Brown Deer Police Department responded to 1358 calls for service, issued 341 traffic citations, 94 parking citations and made 164 non-traffic related arrests/citations. Overall activity level was lower when compared with the prior year.

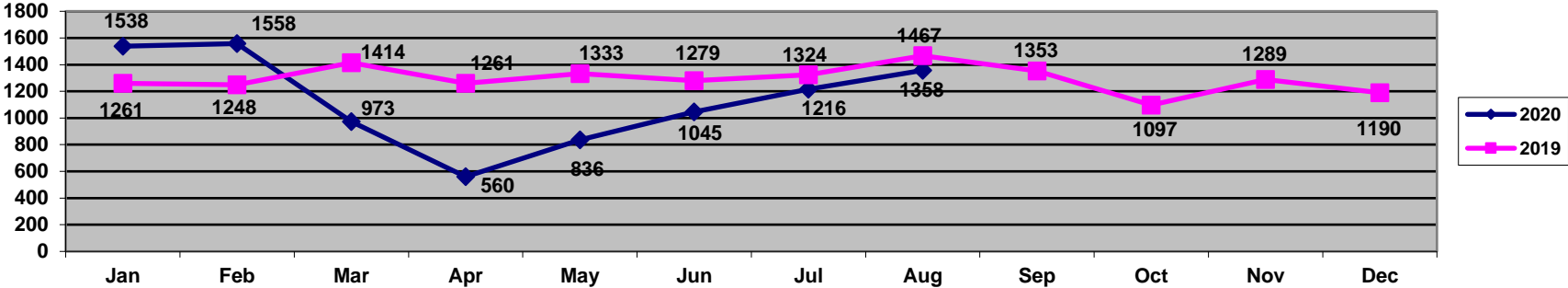
Officer Lesnik and K9 "Haber" were officially badged.



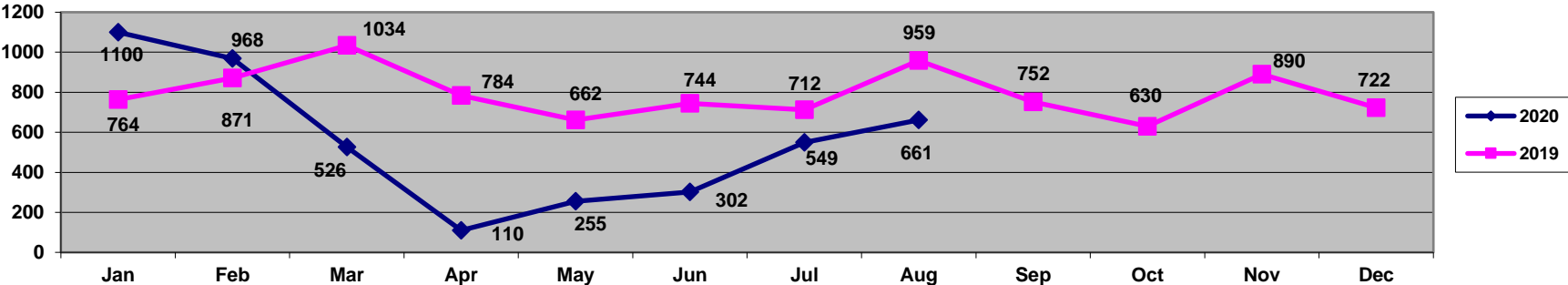
Officer Dawson retired from the Department after 15 years of service.



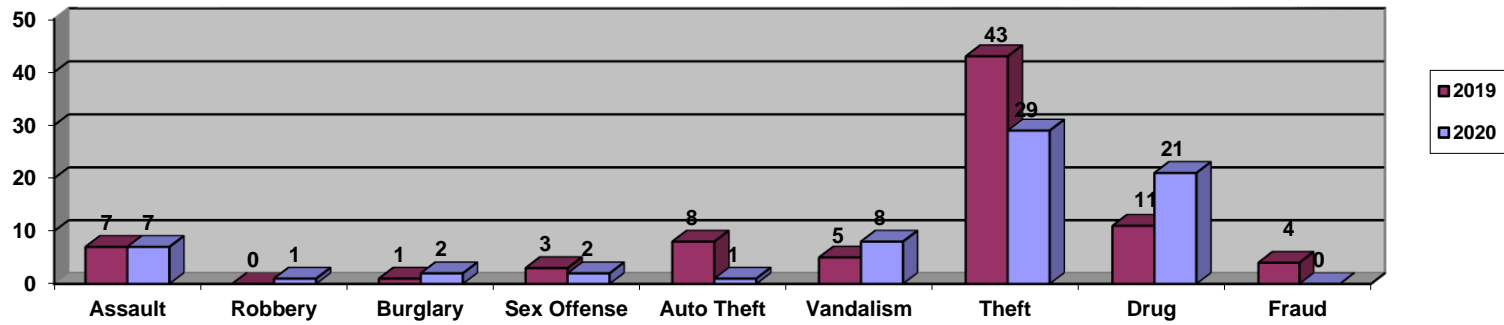
**2019/2020 Year to Date  
Calls for Service**



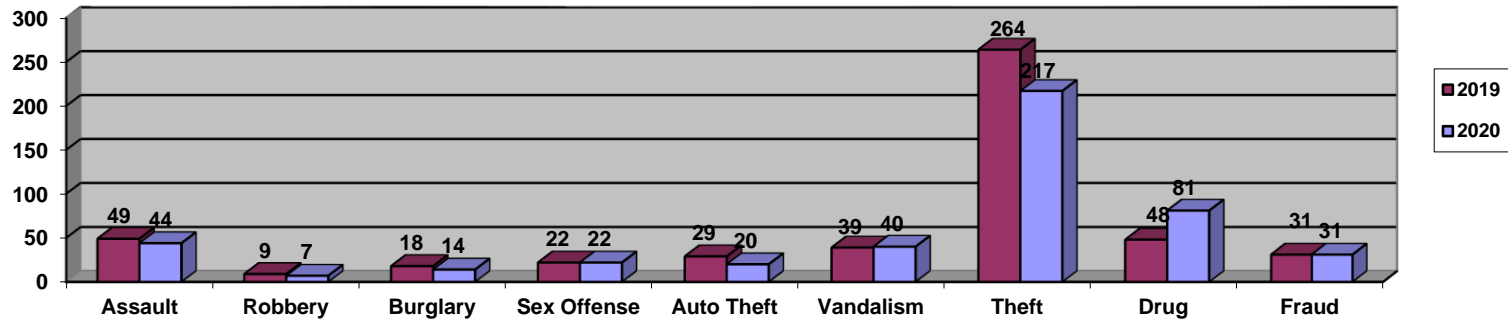
**2019/2020 Year to Date  
Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)**



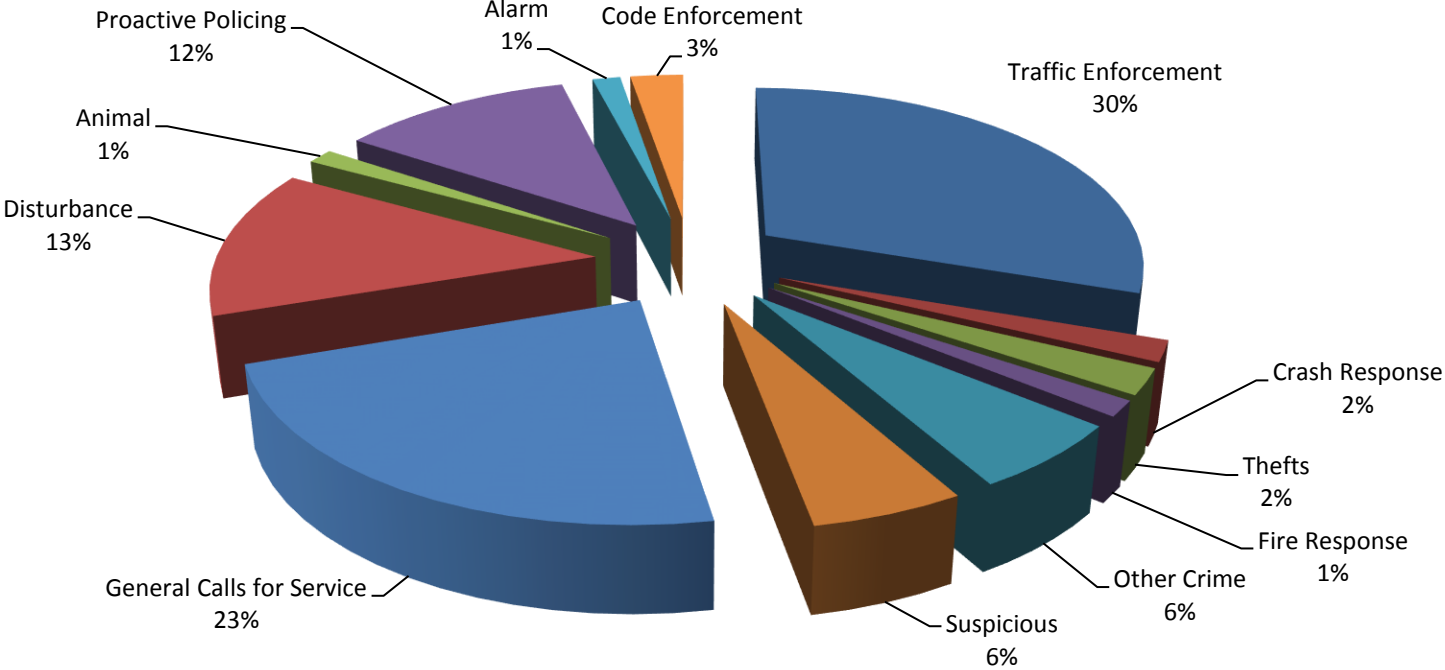
### Reported Crime Comparison August 2019/2020



### Reported Crime Comparison Year to Date

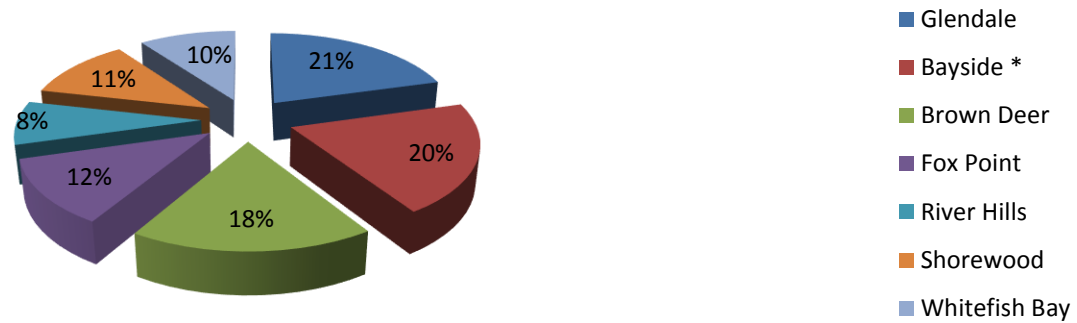


# August 2020 Allocation of Police Services



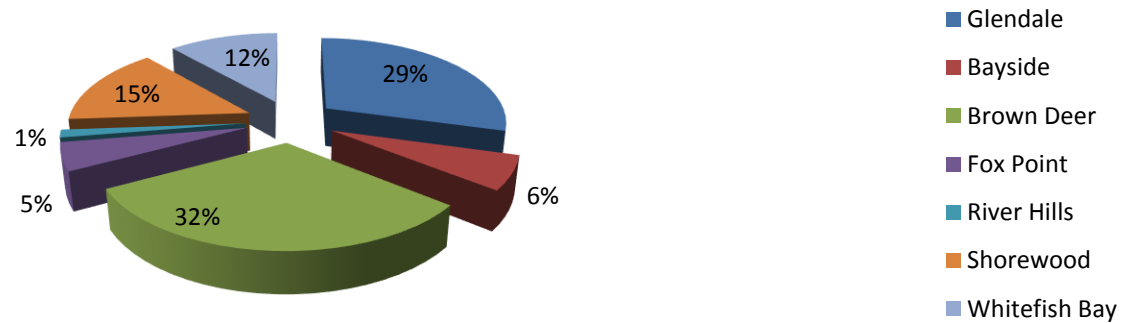

## North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction



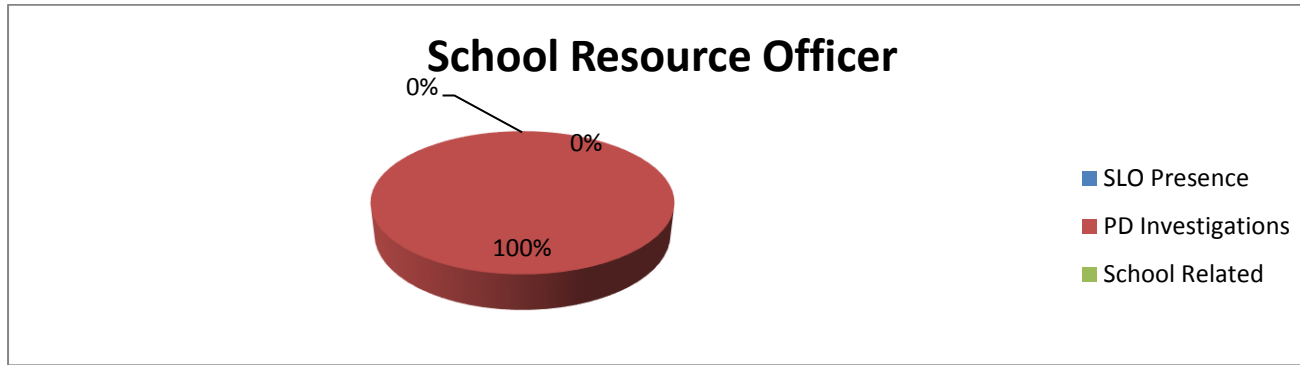
\* 70% of Bayside Reported Incidents are associated with the Communications Center

## North Shore Part I & II Criminal Offenses by Jurisdiction



Part I offenses include: Homicide, assaults, burglary, robbery, theft and MV theft.

Part II offenses include general order crimes such as disorderly conduct, frauds, vandalism, narcotic offenses.



The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Resource Officer (SRO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SRO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SRO Presence – Time the officer was physically present in the school.

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.
