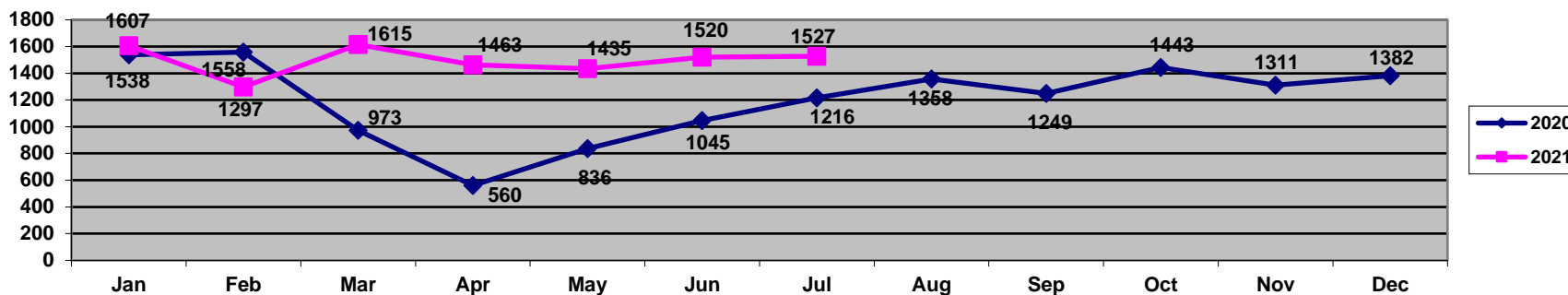

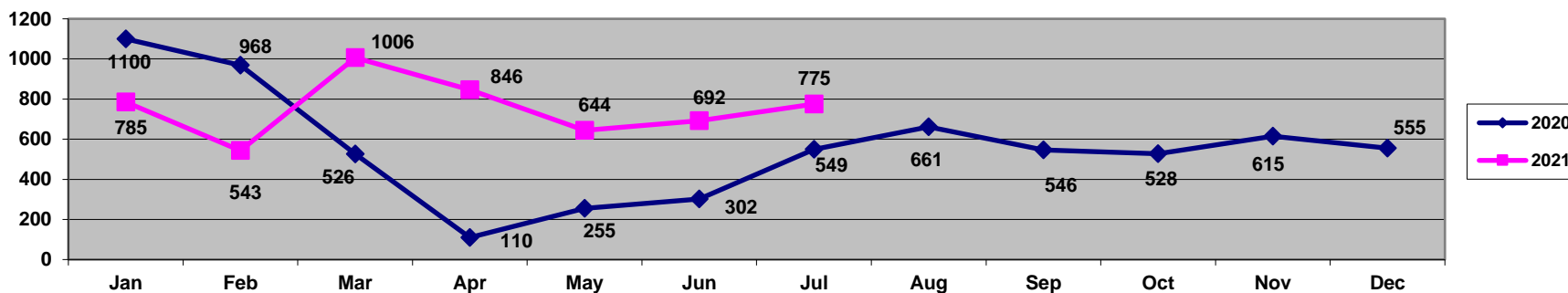

2020/2021 Year to Date Calls for Service

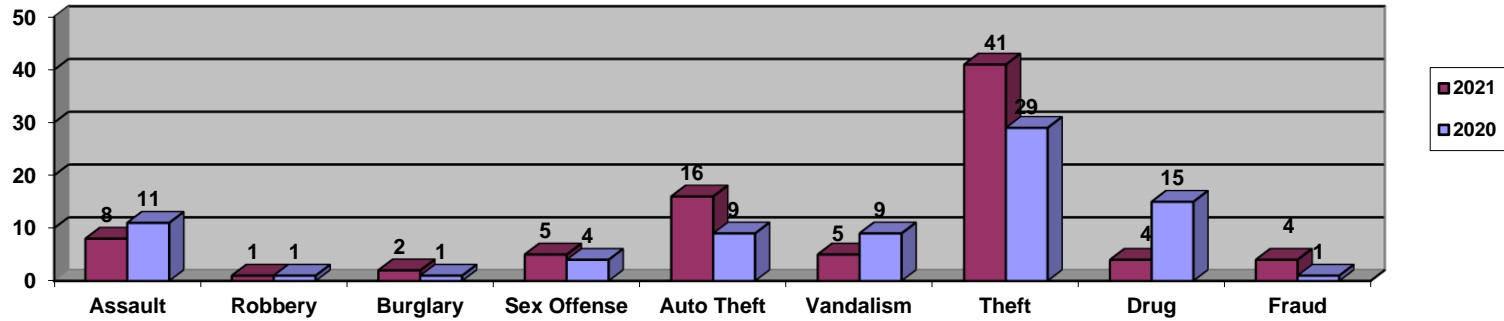


2020/2021 Year to Date Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)

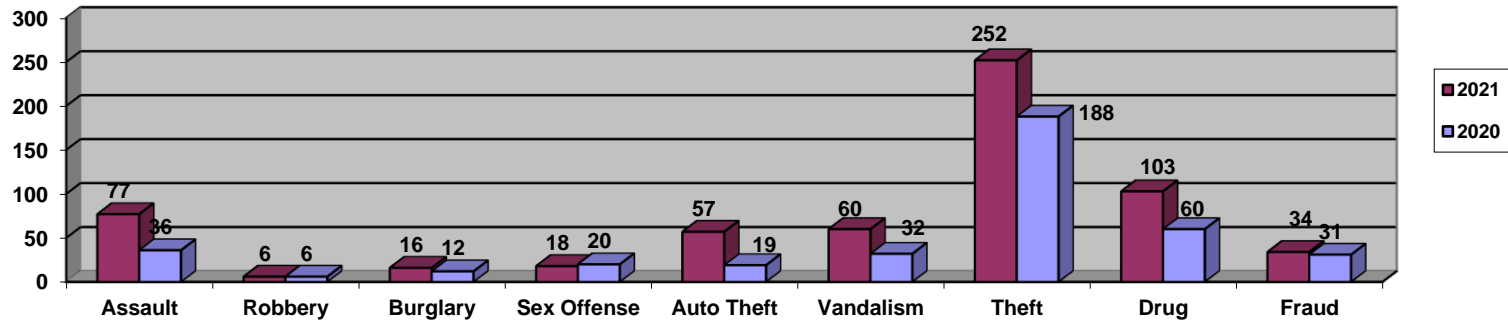


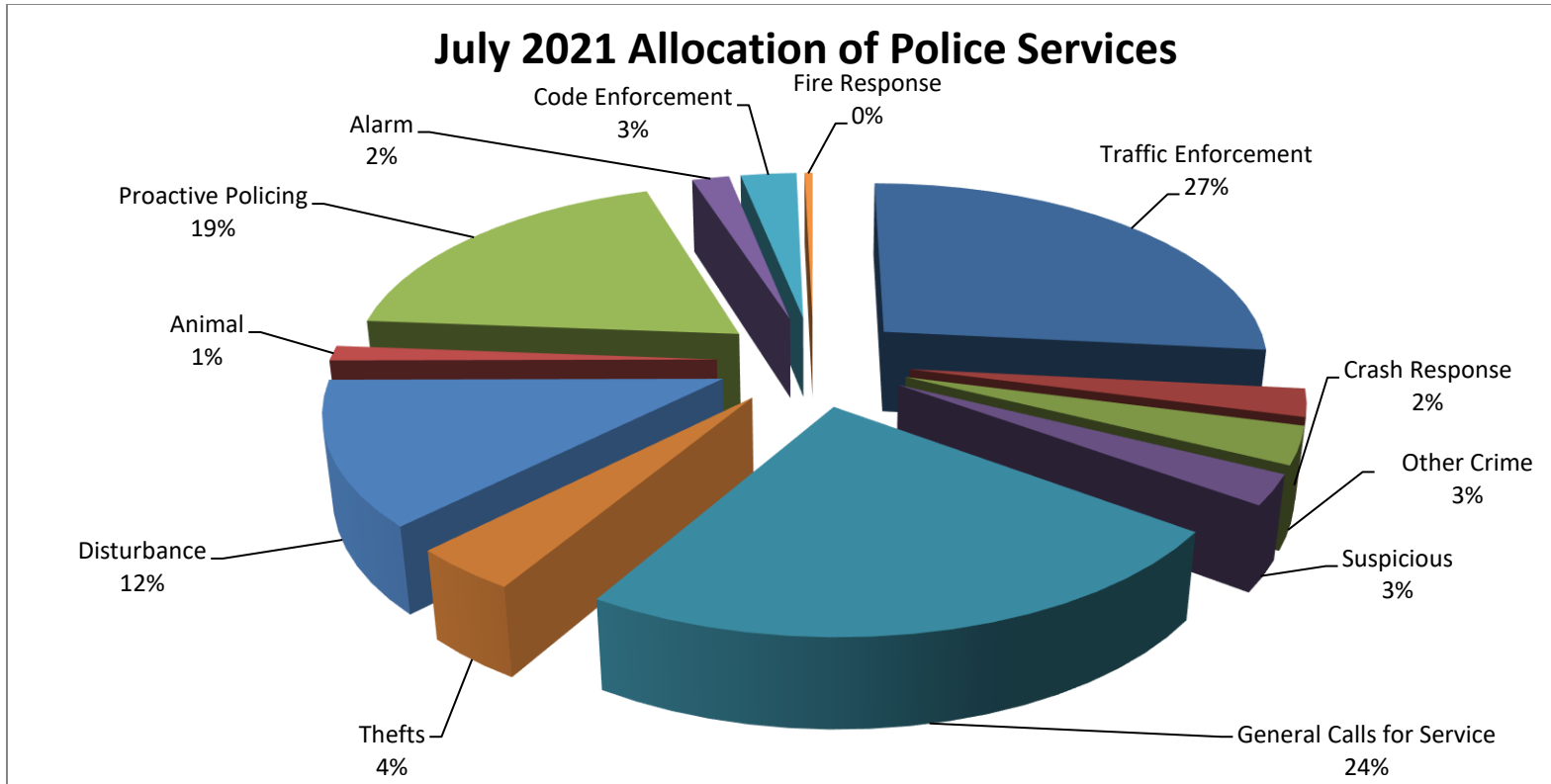
Reported Crime Comparison

July 2020/2021



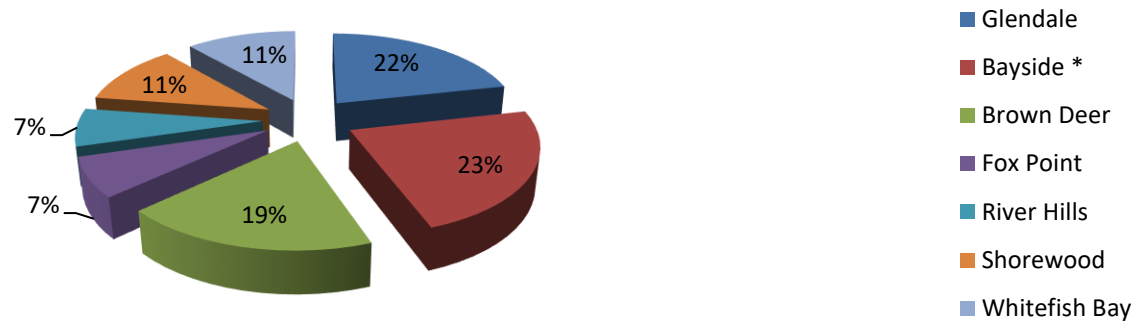
Reported Crime Comparison Year to Date





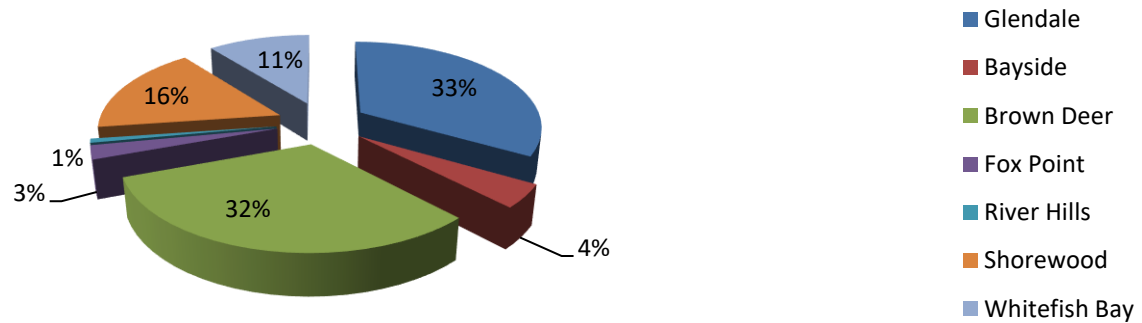

North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction



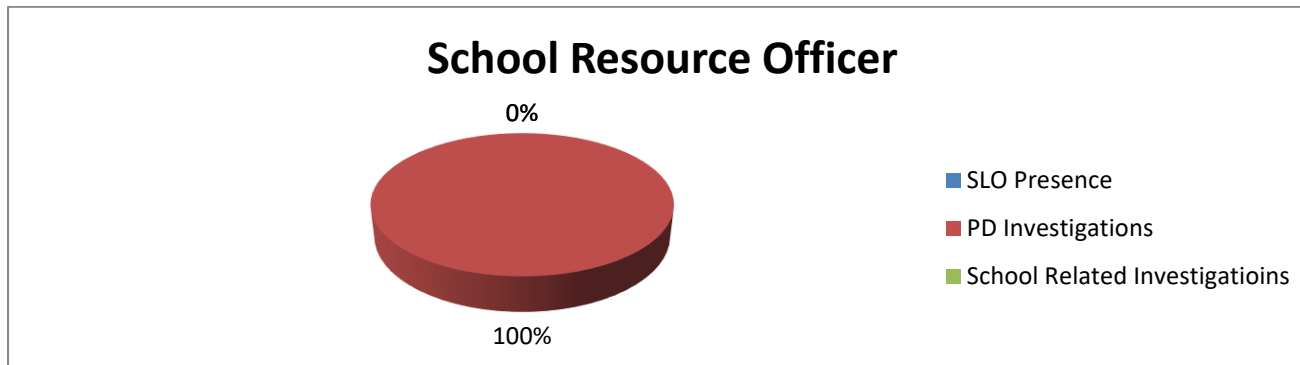
* 70% of Bayside Reported Incidents are associated with the Communications Center.

North Shore Part I & II Criminal Offenses by Jurisdiction



Part I offenses include: Homicide, assaults, burglary, robbery, theft and MV theft.

Part II offenses include general order crimes such as disorderly conduct, frauds, vandalism, narcotic offenses.



The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Resource Officer (SRO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SRO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.
