During the month of August, the Brown Deer Police Department responded to 1392 calls for service, issued 224 traffic citations, 130 parking citations and made 135 non-traffic related arrests/citations. Overall calls for service increased substantially from the prior month and prior year.

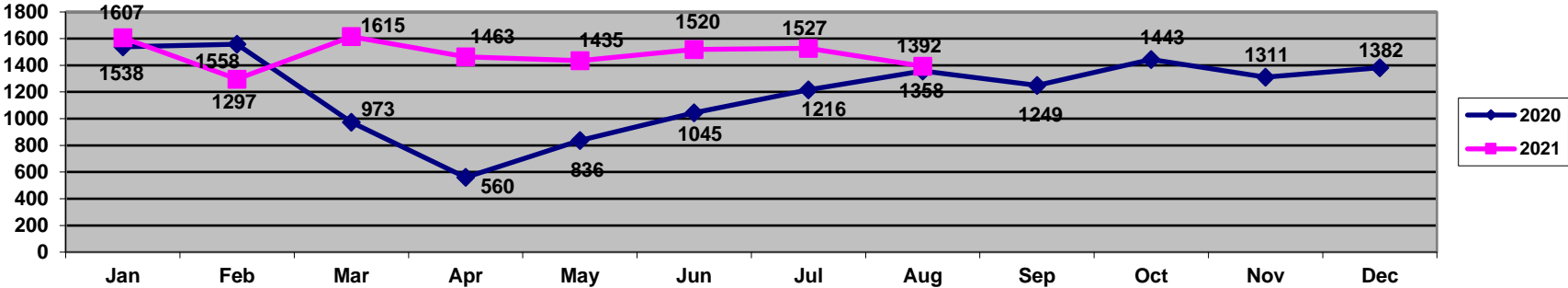
### Chief's Report

On August 3<sup>rd</sup> the Brown Deer Police Department hosted the North Shore National Night Out. Special thanks to all those who participated in making the event a success.

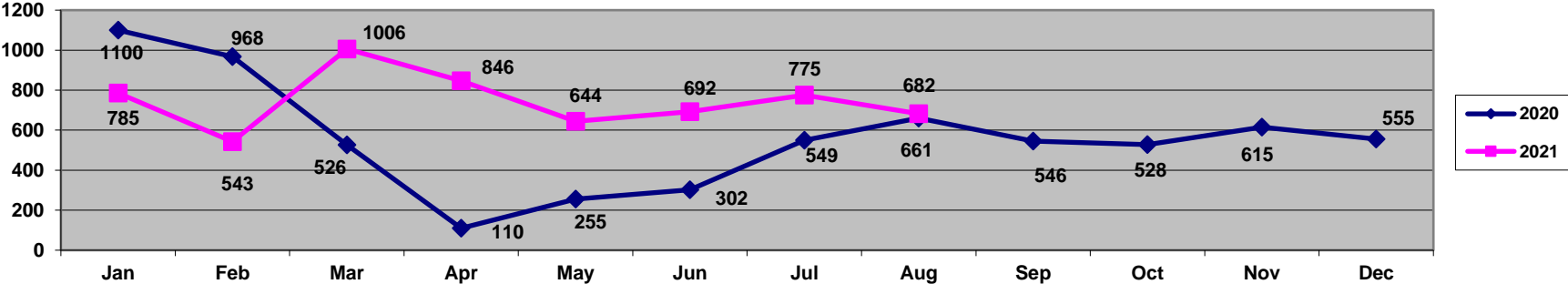

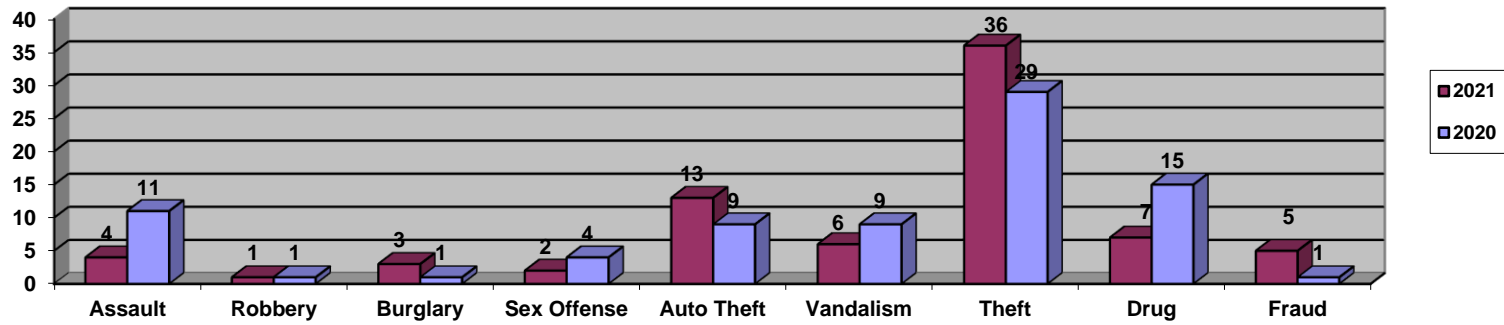
**2020/2021 Year to Date  
Calls for Service**



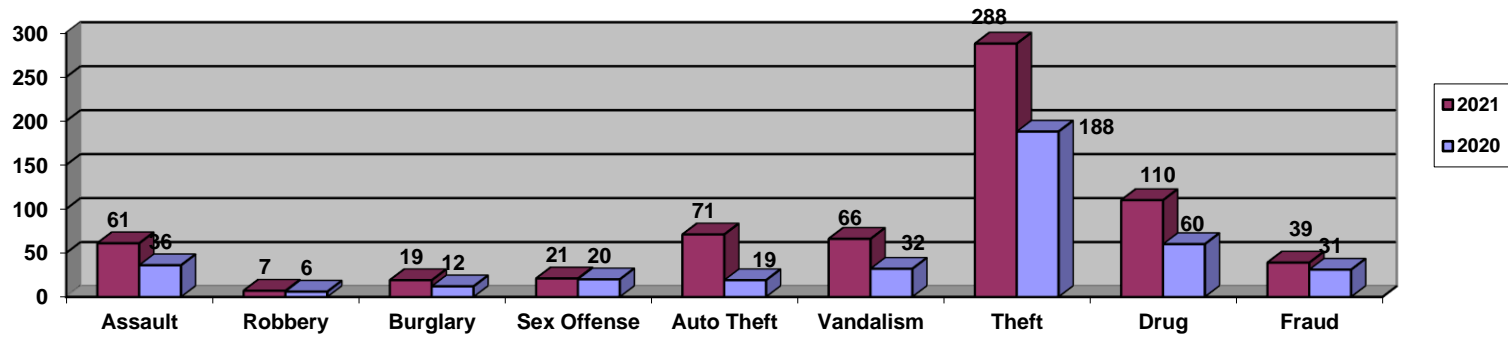
**2020/2021 Year to Date  
Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)**

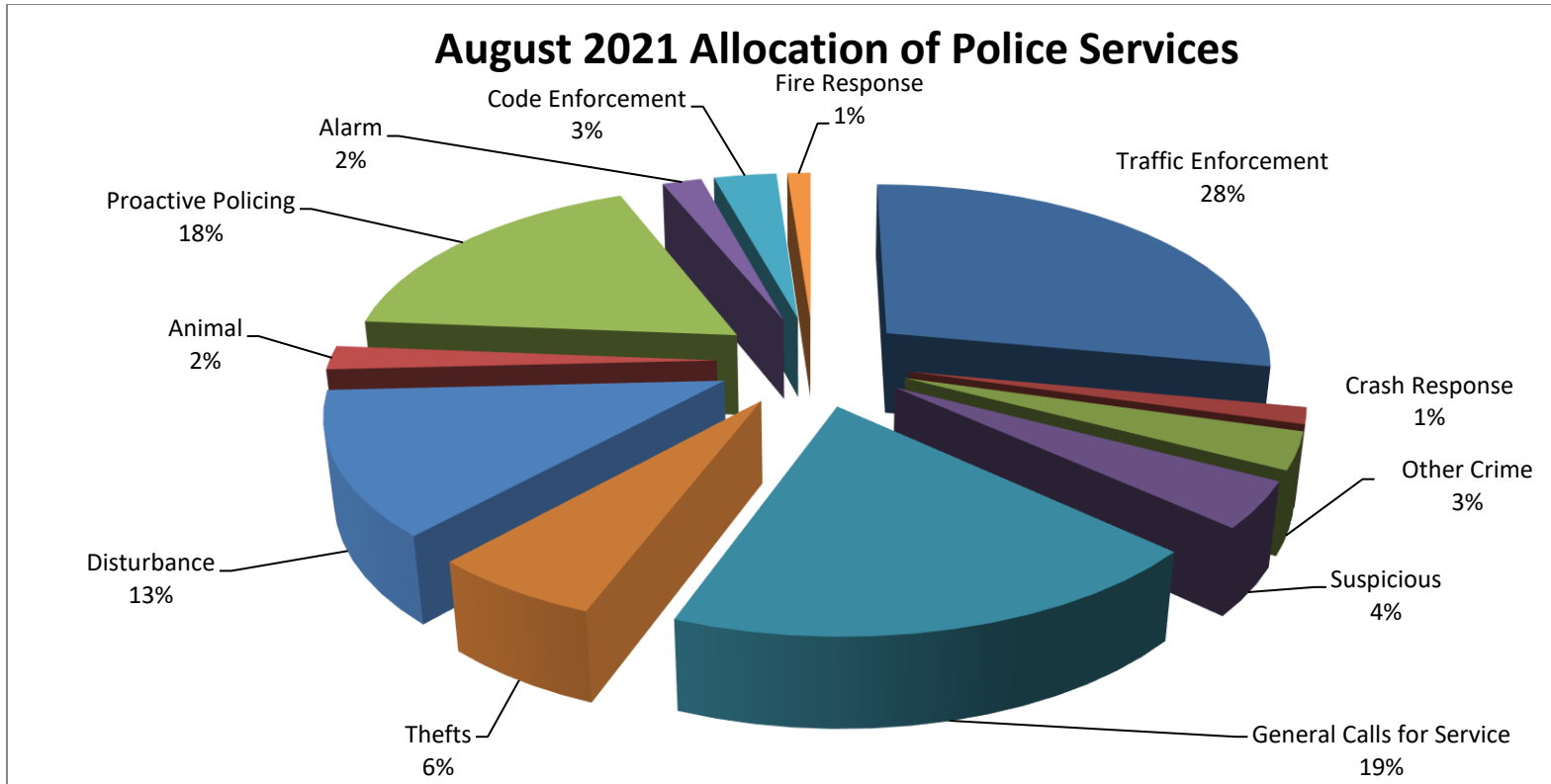


### Reported Crime Comparison August 2020/2021



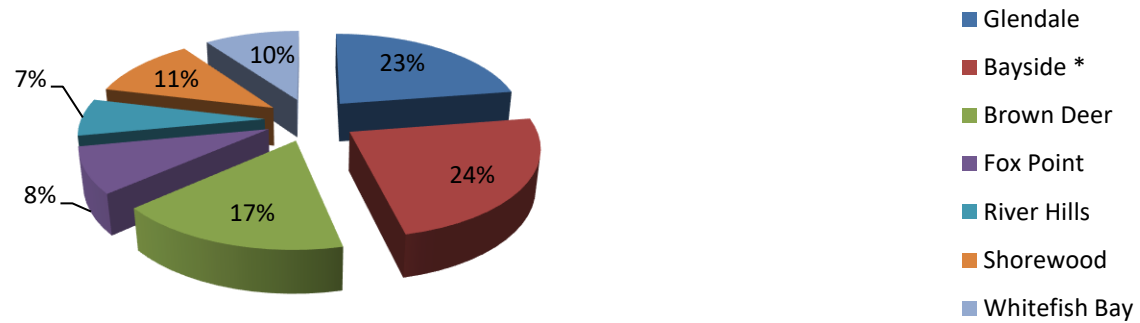
### Reported Crime Comparison Year to Date





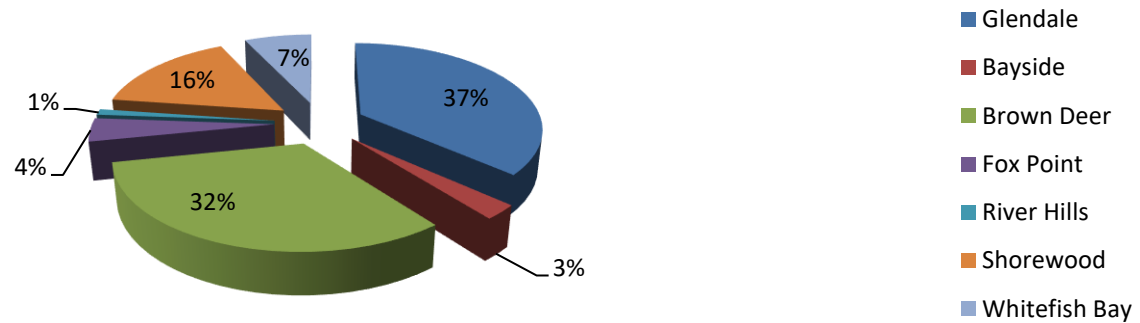

## North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction

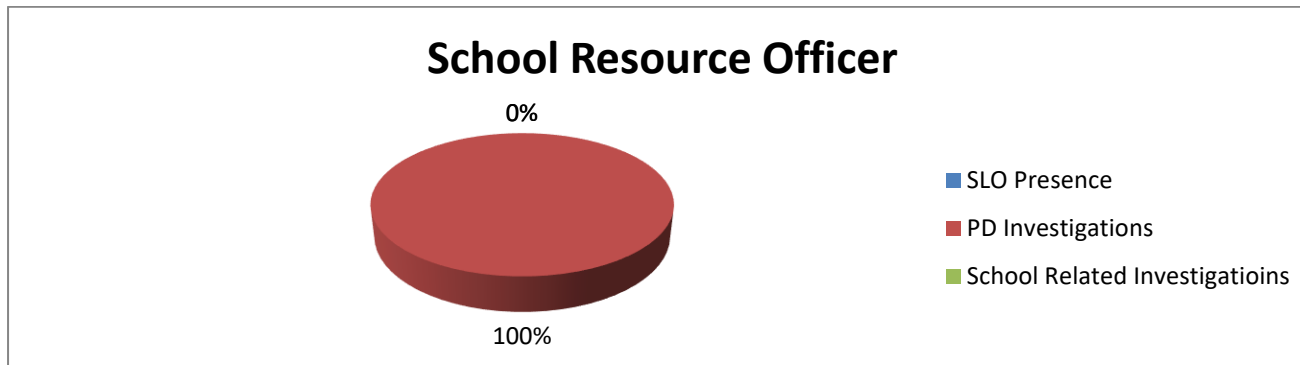


\* 70% of Bayside Reported Incidents are associated with the Communications Center.

## North Shore Part I & II Criminal Offenses by Jurisdiction



Part I offenses include: Homicide, assaults, burglary, robbery, theft and MV theft.  
 Part II offenses include general order crimes such as disorderly conduct, frauds, vandalism, narcotic offenses.
