The meeting was called to order by Trustee Springman at 5:30 PM.

I. ROLL CALL

II. PERSONS DESIRING TO BE HEARD

The committee members briefly introduced themselves.

III. CONSIDERATION OF MINUTES: February 9, 2017

*It was moved by Mr. Wazniak, and seconded by Mr. Gordon to approve the February 9, 2017 meeting minutes. The motion carried unanimously.*

IV. REPORT OF STAFF/COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Captain Schmitz reported that Officers Hansen and Andersen attended Northwestern Motorcycle School in the spring. He further reported that Officers Glasenapp and Lozano were in their final phases of the field training program and should be on the road in September. Captain Schmitz stated that Officer McShane recently started phase one of the field training program and Desk Officers Metanova and Bartosik will be starting the police academy August 21<sup>st</sup> and that the department should be at full staff by the end of year.

Matthew Maederer reported that Crowley Construction were working on the pavement markings throughout the Village and that County Line Road was recently seal coated by Mequon. He stated that the work on North 51<sup>st</sup> Street was on schedule and that water hook ups and paving were being worked on at this time.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Citizen Traffic Concern – West Betty Lane at North 56<sup>th</sup> Street

Matthew Maederer reported an email was received from Mr. Peter Collins with concern about vehicles driving eastbound on West Betty Lane at North 56<sup>th</sup> Street. Mr. Maederer researched the

area for placement of Chevron Arrows. He reported that the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officers recommend that chevron arrows be added to curves 135 degrees or greater. The curve at this area is 136 degrees warranting either signage. It will be implemented by November.

*Myrna Collins, 4908 West Calumet Road* was in attendance on behalf of Peter Collins and opined that the problem was understood by the Department of Public Works and appreciated the outcome on behalf of her brother.


B. Village Ordinance 62.152 – All Terrain Vehicles (ATV)

It was stated that this change in the ordinance would bring it in line with State Statutes and basically just removing some verbiage. Mr. Wazniak asked if more snow would be left on roadway with this change and it was opined that it would not.

*It was moved by Trustee Wedward, and seconded by Mr. Kass that the Village Board approve the removal of ATV from Section 62-152 of the Village Code. The motioned carried unanimously.*
