DETAILS:

On Tuesday, January 31, 2017, at 11:01 P.M., Brown Deer Police Officers responded to a suspicious vehicle call in the 4600 block of W. Woodale Ave. in Brown Deer. The caller stated that three subjects, one driving a dark colored vehicle and two walking outside the vehicle were parked on the side of the roadway and two appeared to have guns. Upon officer arrival, the vehicle took off leaving two male black subjects wearing dark clothing behind. Both ran from officers on foot between houses in the residential area. A call then came in that the World Petro Mart gas station at 4685 W. Bradley Road a block away may have had an attempted robbery. The two subjects involved were wearing dark clothing and masks with one holding something dark in his hand. Neither could gain entry as the gas station door was locked. The two then ran south behind the gas station to where officers had been dispatched for the suspicious vehicle.

As both subjects had run and were no longer in view, a perimeter was set up using Brown Deer and area North Shore police agency squads. A search was conducted and one 22 year old Milwaukee man, a convicted felon, was located hiding behind a fence and a loaded black handgun was located nearby. Tracks in the snow connected the man as one of the subjects that was attempting to get in the World Petro Mart. The man was taken to the Milwaukee County Criminal Justice Facility to await a charging conference for a felon being in possession of a handgun and for his actions at World Petro Mart. No one was injured during this incident.

The other subject on foot was not located and appeared to have been picked up by someone in a vehicle. The suspicious vehicle that fled was described as a possible black mid-90's Pontiac Firebird (2-door) that was road salt covered. The description of the male subject is that he had a blue jacket and his face was covered with a possible mask. The driver of the vehicle is unknown.

The incident (Case 17-1115) remains under investigation.
