## Department of Public Works

**GENERAL:** The Director attended the Village Board meeting on Monday, March 16th. The main item of discussion at the meeting revolved around the feasibility study of the existing Village municipal buildings which include Village Hall, DPW, and the Library. The Village is starting the process of examining the condition of the existing buildings and documenting needed repairs. As part of the feasibility study a report will be provided detailing the costs of repairs and discussing the feasibility of renovating the existing buildings versus constructing a new centralized "municipal complex" which would house all buildings/departments under one roof at one location. The Board approved the contract with Bray Architects to the Village Board. Further information and details regarding the study will be shared with the public as the process moves forward.

**WINTER OPERATIONS:** DPW crews are working on re-installing/ repairing damaged mailboxes during winter operations activities. Crews are also pulling the hydrant markers and roadway markers along each of their respective plow routes. Turf damage is also assessed within each plow route. If you notice turf damage which resulted from winter operations please call DPW.



**STORMWATER:** The Stormwater Technician was called-in after hours for emergency roadway flooding at the 5900 block of W. Bradley Road adjacent to the School. The inlet grate on the north side of Bradley was obstructed and thus cleared free allowing water to drain relieving the roadway flooding.
