Staff met with community members, trustees, police, fire and elected officials of Shorewood to talk about and work on raising awareness regarding the current rise in heroin use.



Route 276 a new Milwaukee County Transit bus service began operating on March 22nd.

The route generally travels east/west through the Village along Brown Deer Road & connects the various commercial/ industrial sites in the Village.

Department of Public Works

GENERAL: The Director attended the pre-construction conference for the N. 60th St. water main relay and sanitary sewer lateral replacement project on Tuesday, March 24th with the contractor (MJ Construction, Inc. out of Milwaukee) and the Brown Deer Water Utility. Hank Wallenkamp from the Water Utility will be the Village's on-site inspector for the project. The project is expected to start on Monday, April 13th with a substantial completion date of mid-June ahead of the roadway reconstruction project which is under a separate contract through the WisDOT. The roadway will be closed to thru traffic during the utility relay work and roadway reconstruction.

Street & Traffic: DPW crews continue filling potholes throughout the Village with cold-patch asphalt. Special attention is given to W. Bradley Rd between N. 60th St and N. Teutonia Ave. W. Bradley Rd requires routine maintenance due to the failing concrete surface. W. Bradley Rd between N. 51st St & N. Sherman Blvd. is scheduled for pavement replacement and reconstruction this spring and summer (2015).




Brown Deer Library
