

NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

West Nile Virus is a disease transferred to humans by infected mosquitos. The mosquitos become infected by feeding off of infected birds and can then transmit the virus to other animals, birds or humans.



Starting in spring people can report dead birds found near their homes to: **Dead Bird Reporting Hotline: 1-800-433-1610.** After reporting to the hotline, the bird can be submitted to the local health department to be sent in for West Nile Virus testing.

Only about 20% of people infected experience mild symptoms that may include of fever, headache, eye pain, muscle aches, joint pain, swollen lymph nodes, nausea or vomiting. The best way to prevent an infection is to prevent mosquito bites.

This includes:

- limiting the time spent outdoors at dawn and dusk during mosquito season (June to September) or other times mosquitoes are active
- wearing shoes, socks, long sleeve shirts and long pants when outdoors
- applying insect repellents containing an EPA-registered ingredient, such as DEET to exposed skin when outdoors
- spraying clothing with insect repellents since mosquitoes may bite through thin clothing
- making sure your home window and door screens are in good repair to prevent mosquito entry.


Community Vibes Summer Concert Series
