

## **NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT**

North Shore reported the first dead crow that tested positive for West Nile Virus in Milwaukee County. This means residents need to be more vigilant in their personal protective measures to prevent mosquito bites. Every spring the health dept. checks for mosquito larva in sewers to determine the best time to apply larvicide, which helps to reduce the amount of mosquitos in the area. The health department also recommends the following:

- Limit time spent outside at dawn and dusk, when mosquitoes are most active.
- Apply insect repellent to clothing as well as exposed skin since mosquitoes may bite through clothing.
- Make sure window and door screens are in good repair to prevent mosquito entry.
- Properly dispose of items that hold water, such as tin cans, plastic containers, ceramic pots, or discarded tires.
- Clean roof gutters and downspouts for proper drainage.
- Turn over wheelbarrows, wading pools, boats, and canoes when not in use.
- Change the water in birdbaths and pet dishes at least every three days.
- Clean and chlorinate swimming pools, outdoor saunas, and hot tubs; drain water from pool covers.
- Trim tall grass, weeds, and vines since mosquitoes use these areas to rest during hot daylight hours.
- Landscape to prevent water from pooling in low-lying areas.

## **Weekly Health Tips**

### **Brush & Floss!**

Brushing and flossing helps remove the sticky film of bacteria on our teeth called plaque. Plaque that is not removed may harden and inflame gum tissue. Gum disease can lead to tooth loss and has been linked to a variety of non-oral health conditions, including heart disease and diabetes.



### **"Perishable Food"**

People of all ages carry bag lunches to school or work. Perishable food must be kept cold while commuting via bicycle, car, bus, subway or on foot. ## **Village Feasibility Study – Update**

After conducting a Feasibility Study on Brown Deer municipal buildings, consultants from Bray Architects identified the pressing need for major repairs and upgrades to the Department of Public Works Complex.

From this analysis two viable alternatives were presented to the Village Board: 1) Repair the current 1966 Public Works buildings in the Original Village neighborhood or 2) Pursue the construction of a new facility south of the existing Village Hall site.

The Village Board has directed Village staff and Bray Architects to further present these findings to the public. Residents are invited to any of the following events to gain an understanding of the issues and alternatives:


