

Come play & build with Legos! The club is open to anyone who is old enough to play with Legos by themselves.




Superhero Party: Wed., August 12th 6-7:00pm.

Did You Know ...

The primary carriers of the rabies virus in Wisconsin are bats and skunks. Humans & other domestic animals almost always become infected from exposure to one of these carriers. The last "4" cases of rabies occurred in 1959, 2000, 2004 & 2010, all of the cases acquired the disease from an infected bat



To prevent exposure:

- Stay away from all wild animals, especially those acting abnormally.
- Exclude bats from living quarters by keeping screens in good repair and closing any small openings that could allow access.
- Vaccinate pet dogs, cats, ferrets, & livestock against rabies

Keep in mind bat bites or scratches can be very hard to identify & may go unnoticed. If you have been or think you may have been bitten, scratched or had physical contact with a bat, skunk, or other animal that could possibly carry the rabies virus contact your local health dept. The most effective thing you can do is immediately clean the wound with soap & water. If the animal is still around **DO NOT** destroy or release it until consulting with a public health authority. The local health dept. will then talk you through what to do next depending on what type of animal bit you, if the animal is available for testing or observation, & if post-exposure prophylaxis is recommended.

REMEMBER: Exposure does not always result in rabies & if preventive treatment is obtained promptly following exposure, virtually all cases of rabies can be prevented. However, if preventive treatment is not administered, once signs of rabies develop, the disease is almost always fatal. Weekly Health Tip

August is National Breastfeeding Month

Breast milk has disease-fighting anti-bodies that can help protect infants from several types of illnesses & mothers who breastfeed have a lower risk of health problems incl. breast cancer & type 2 diabetes. Women have the right to breastfeed & are protected by Wisconsin State Statute 253.165 to breastfeed their child in any public or private location where both are authorized to be.

The Fair Labor Standards Act also requires employers to provide reasonable break time to express breast milk for a nursing child until 1 year after the birth & a place other than a bathroom to be used for expressing milk. Help protect our children by giving mothers the support & encouragement they need to breastfeed.



