

NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

January is National Radon Action Month. Radon is an odorless, tasteless, naturally occurring radioactive gas that may be in your home. It is the leading cause of lung cancer deaths of nonsmokers and claims about 21,000 American lives each year. Take action this month and test your home for radon.

Test kits are available at the health department for just \$5. Stop in during office hours to pick one up. Otherwise some home improvement stores sell radon test kits as well.

Exposure to radon can be prevented by testing your home and mitigating high radon levels. For a list of certified radon measurement & mitigation contractors please visit Wisconsin Dept. of Health Services website at www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/radon/radon-proficiency.htm



The North Shore Health Department participates in several initiatives supporting **Wisconsin's Health Brain Initiative Project**. The health department provided feedback to the state on their Building Dementia-Friendly Communities toolkit and has distributed the toolkit to communities in the North Shore. The health dept. also serves on the Shorewood Connects' Dementia Awareness Workgroup. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

Unoccupied properties can become blight in the community as there is no longer a responsible occupant. To help the Village better manage foreclosed properties & all other building vacancies, the CSDD continues to implement a recently approved **(VPRO) Vacant Property Registration Ordinance**. The VPRO is designed to help the Village track vacancies & establish reliable contacts to preserve the appearance and physical condition of empty abandoned and foreclosed properties.

All vacant properties must be registered with the Village within 90 days of vacancy & renewed on an annual basis if the property remains unoccupied for an administrative fee of \$100

The ordinance also requires quarterly inspections by the owner or its agent to insure basic standards for exterior/interior maintenance of the property, and to reduce blight in the community. If you are concerned about a vacant property in your neighborhood and want to ensure that it is registered please contact Zoning and Planning Specialist Fernando Moreno at 414-371-3032.
