

Weekly Health Tips



Never let raw meat, poultry, or seafood touch cooked meat or any ready-to-eat foods, as this can cause cross-contamination.

Foodborne pathogens from the raw meat can easily spread to ready-to-eat foods and cause food poisoning, yet 24% of Americans report not properly separating these foods.

Make sure you always use separate plates, cutting boards, and utensils to keep raw meats, poultry, and seafood separate from ready-to-eat foods.

DID YOU KNOW?



September 18th – 24th, 2016 is **National Child Passenger Safety Week**. Some studies have shown that approximately 75% of child safety seats are not installed correctly. Motor vehicle injuries are a leading cause of death among children in the United States. Many of these deaths and injuries can be prevented by proper use of car seats, boosters, and seat belts. Car seats, booster seats and seat belts are the law in Wisconsin but many are not being used correctly. Car seat information is easy to find, but often it's hard for parents and caregivers to decide which seat is best for their child. Follow these tips to ensure your child is in the right seat:

- Choose the right direction: Rear or forward facing
- Check the label to make sure the seat is appropriate for your child age, weight, and height
- Know your car seats history

Health Director attended a meeting with the **Children's Health Alliance of Wisconsin** on integrating clinical and community care. Collaborating with the healthcare system to extend access to preventative services in the community can help improve population health.

**The Paradox of Being a Black Police
Officer in Today's Society
Presented by Corey Saffold**

Officer Corey Saffold is a law enforcement professional in Madison, and is known in the community for his volunteerism and his work with youth of all ages and demographic backgrounds. In addition to his service throughout the city of Madison, Officer Saffold is entrusted by his superiors to do the sensitive work of policing in one of the city's larger public high schools as a School Liaison Officer. In his talk, Corey will discuss his experiences as a Black policeman in the wake of multiple, highly publicized killings of unarmed African-Americans by police officers. Additionally, Officer Saffold will address the paradox of being a Black officer during a time when police are viewed as an enemy and are often not trusted, especially among the African-American community. The shooting and killing of unarmed African-Americans has intensified already strained relations between the community and the police. As such, Officer Saffold will offer his strategy for engaging the community at large around these issues that have also affected him personally. Corey will relay his personal experiences with law enforcement and how these experiences have helped to shape his approach to upholding the law throughout the city.


