



WEEKLY DEPARTMENTAL REPORT

REPORT DATE: May 1st, 2018

GENERAL: The Director and Village Manager attended a meeting with Advanced Disposal (the Village’s waste/recycling contractor) to discuss the new 7-year contract extension which was previously approved by the Village Board. The new contract expires December 31st, 2025. All services remain the same except bulk collection was added. Bulk collection will begin in August. Additional details will be provided in utility bills, the fall magazine, social media, and Village website...stay tuned!

On Monday, April 23rd the Director and Sanitary Sewer Technician attended the pre-construction meeting for the Village’s 2018 Sanitary Sewer Mainline and Lateral Rehabilitation project. The contractor for the work is Visu-Sewer (with Musson Brothers as their sub-contractor). The project will take place in the neighborhood tributary to N. 59th Street/W. Betty Lane/W. Range Avenue. All of the public sewer main will be lined using cured in-place pipe (CIPP) and paid for through the sewer utility. A total of 75-sewer laterals will also be lined using CIPP and paid for with MMSD funding. The project will mid-May and be completed by Labor Day.

The Director gave a presentation on the Village’s green infrastructure efforts at the UWM Freshwater Sciences Center on Tuesday, April 24th. The presentation focused on the Badger Meter River Park and W. Bradley Road Bio-Median projects.

The Director and Engineering Technician attended the “Clean Water Clean Lakes” conference on Thursday, April 26th. The conference focused on stormwater green infrastructure projects in the region.

On Tuesday, May 1st, the Director, Village Manager, and Community Development Director attended a meeting at Village Hall with the Developer, Architect, and Engineer for the N. Deerwood Drive redevelopment project located at the old Church/School property in the Original Village.

On Wednesday, May 2nd thru Friday, May 4th the Director attended the American Public Works Association Conference in Green Bay.

WINTER OPERATIONS: The DPW crew completed a full plowing operation after the spring snow event on Thursday, April 19th.

The Mechanic is switching the 6-plow trucks from winter operations to summer operations (i.e. removing plow wings, etc.).

SANITARY SEWER: The Sanitary Sewer Technician is completing routine sewer line cleaning throughout the Village.

STORMWATER: The stormwater technician continues spring street sweeping activities in the curb and gutter roadway sections and throughout the entire Village as per our permit with the WDNR.

The Director submitted the annual stormwater report to the WDNR detailing the 2017 stormwater maintenance activities.

REMINDER: All culvert replacements and driveway approach paving work requires a permit. Culvert replacements are completed in-house by DPW crews ahead of the residential driveway approach paving. Please contact the DPW office for more information.

BEAUTIFICATION/FORESTRY: The DPW crews started weed control and fertilizer application within median areas located throughout the Village the week of April 30th.

STREETS & TRAFFIC: The DPW crews are filling potholes throughout the Village with cold-patch asphalt as time allows.

REFUSE AND RECYCLING: The DPW crews are picking trash/litter throughout the Village within medians and terraces as time allows and when not completing winter operations.

The Director submitted the annual recycling report to the WDNR for the 2017 activities. The report is required as part of the Village's grant from the State (annual grant is approx. \$40,000).

The Recycling Center is on spring/summer hours for the month of May and is open on **Saturdays from 10am to 5pm along with Tuesdays and Thursdays from 12pm to 8pm.** For further information regarding the recycling center please call the DPW office at 414.357.0120.

PARKS & RECREATION: The DPW crew assisted with the Deer Run event set-up and tear-down. The DPW crew is also assisting with soccer net hanging and baseball field prep work at Fairy Chasm Park while the Park & Rec Director is on light duty work restriction.
