During the month of June the Brown Deer Police Department responded to 1279 calls for service, issued 387 traffic citations, 131 parking citations and made 106 non-traffic related arrests/citations. Overall activity level was lower when compared with the prior year.

Chief's Report


Kendra Kunkel was sworn in as a Police Officer and has started the twelve-week field training program.




Sergeant Joe Hahn completed Northwestern University's School of Staff and Command. The ten-week course covers all aspects of police leadership and administration.




**2018/2019 Year to Date
Calls for Service**




**2018/2019 Year to Date
Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)**




Reported Crime Comparison June 2018/2019



Reported Crime Comparison Year to Date




June 2019 Allocation of Police Services





North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction




* 70% of Bayside Reported Incidents are associated with the Communications Center

North Shore Part I & II Criminal Offenses by Jurisdiction



Part I offenses include: Homicide, assaults, burglary, robbery, theft and MV theft.
 Part II offenses include general order crimes such as disorderly conduct, frauds, vandalism, narcotic offenses.



The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Resource Officer (SRO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SRO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SRO Presence – Time the officer was physically present in the school.

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.

There were zero calls for service at the BDMHS and four calls for service at the BMES.
