
The Department responded to or engaged in nine Safer at Home violations for the month.

The Department concluded its officer hiring process and selected two individuals who will begin field training June 15th, 2020.




**2019/2020 Year to Date
Calls for Service**




**2019/2020 Year to Date
Enforcement Action (arrests, citations & warnings)**




Reported Crime Comparison May 2019/2020



Reported Crime Comparison Year to Date




May 2020 Allocation of Police Services





North Shore Reported Incidents by Jurisdiction




* 70% of Bayside Reported Incidents are associated with the Communications Center

North Shore Part I & II Criminal Offenses by Jurisdiction



Part I offenses include: Homicide, assaults, burglary, robbery, theft and MV theft.

Part II offenses include general order crimes such as disorderly conduct, frauds, vandalism, narcotic offenses.



The Department has one Investigator that also serves as a School Resource Officer (SRO). The above graph depicts the percentage of time the SRO spends performing the various duties assigned to them.

SRO Presence – Time the officer was physically present in the school.

School Related – Time spent on school related investigations/reports where the officer was not physically present at the school.

There were 0 calls for service at the BDMHS and 0 calls for service at the BMES.
