# Auto Collision Specialists provides top-quality work in a community they love

When customers come to Auto Collision Specialists, they can expect a top-notch experience from start to finish. Family owned and operated since 1982, the business—located at 8280 N. Teutonia Avenue—handles every aspect of collision repair, said owner Bob Rasmussen.

“No matter what the damage is on a vehicle, we can take care of it,” he said. “There is the obvious repairs, of course, but we handle it all—body and frame, the interior and mechanical components, electronics and everything.”

Perfecting automobiles has been Rasmussen’s passion since his days of attending Brown Deer High School, he said.

“I have always liked cars and I am artsy so I felt like it

would be a good living and fit well with my personality,” he explained.

Rasmussen brings this talent into the business, noting that with their top-of-the-line equipment and highly-skilled personnel, the business “pays attention to detail,” he said. “You would never even know we worked on it.”

“When we repair a car, it comes out looking like there has never been damage,” Rasmussen said. “Everyone’s fear is it will never look the same but we can guarantee it will look very nice.”

The business also prides itself on top-quality custom work on motorcycles and Jeep Wranglers, which “are really popular for contouring,” said Rasmussen.

They also make a point to be “green” by “being conscious of products we can reuse instead of being wasteful,” the owner noted. “We are always looking to be more environmentally-friendly.”

Rasmussen had originally rented a building in Milwaukee, but moved to Brown Deer 23 years ago and has never looked back. With a staff of five, he runs a business that takes a friendly and hands-on approach with the village they serve.

“This is a tight-knit community, everyone knows everyone, and most of our business is word-of-mouth,” he said.

Auto Collision Specialists also services all the village vehicles, from the Department of Public Works car that hit a deer to the police squad vandalized during recent protests. They are also past winners of the village’s Beautification Award for their property and a few years back Rasmussen took on the special project of removing graffiti from the village’s railroad bridge.

“We like being here and we plan on staying active in the community,” said Rasmussen. “This is our home.”

# Former Brown Deer Graduate Zach Baun Drafted by the New Orleans Saints

**W**e are proud of former scholar athlete, Zack Baun, selected by the New Orleans Saints as the 74th pick in the 2020 NFL draft. A former dual-threat quarterback who won the state's Offensive Player of the Year award as a senior at Brown Deer High School. Ironically, he began as a wide receiver but when Brown Deer Varsity Football Coach Rob Green saw him throw the football he became the quarterback that day! He ended up being ranked 23rd quarterback recruit overall by ESPN and the 4th quarterback recruit in the state of Wisconsin. Baun passed for 3,061 yards for Brown Deer along with 27 touchdowns while also rushing for 3,923 yards and another 67 touchdowns. He was named Wisconsin Offensive Player of the Year by the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association as a high school senior. Zach was a multi-sport athlete at Brown Deer playing a vital role in back-to-back state basketball championships and numerous track and field records for the Woodland Conference.

Baun was converted to defense his freshman year at Wisconsin and has never looked back. Baun, 6-3, 225 lbs, is an explosive athlete, who had 12.5 sacks last year for the Badgers. Baun was the first consensus first-team All-America linebacker in Wisconsin school history. A Butkus Award finalist and Bednarik Award semifinalist, Baun received a 91.0 pass-rushing grade from Pro Football Focus last season. Baun was a team captain his senior year at Wisconsin.

On the night of the NFL draft, everyone from Brown Deer, family, and relatives were all watching on the edge of their couches waiting for the word that Zach Baun would get his opportunity to play in the NFL. Then it finally happened, the New Orleans Saints selected Zach Baun in the third round at #74. Cheers and accolades could be heard across Wisconsin! Then in late May, before leaving for New Orleans to begin his new life and career, Zach reached out to Dr. Deb Kerr and the school district and say, "thank you!" His letter reads as follows:

*Dear Brown Deer High School, I am writing to say **THANK YOU** for playing a vital role in my development as an athlete, a scholar, and a man. My two years spent at BDHS showed me that passion drives results that lead to dreams becoming reality. I have been blessed with countless opportunities because of the spark that was*



*ignited during my time at BDHS. This jersey is a small gift but it shows that dreams are much closer than they may seem. **THANK YOU & Forever a Falcon!***

And in typical fashion, this young man was thinking about his alma mater and the people who made a difference in his life. He took the time to show his character which he always has done! Thank you, Zach Baun! We will proudly display your jersey, letter, and shoe to inspire our students each and every day. We are so blessed to have known you. We wish you and your family the very best! You will still be wearing the black and gold! Once a Falcon, Always a Falcon!

# Considerations Before Venturing Out

**A**s North Shore communities and businesses continue to reopen, it is important to stay informed and prepare yourself to take preventive measures when deciding to head out of the house. Community level and individual risk factors should be considered when choosing whether or not to venture out to public places. These factors include how many people you will interact with when out; whether 6 feet of distance can be maintained; whether you will be inside or outside; and how long you will be interacting with others. If you are able to stay physically distanced in an outdoor

space and keep your interactions short, this reduces the risk of COVID-19 transmission. You should also be aware of the current state of community spread in your local area and determine if preventive measures are in place where you are going to determine your potential risk of exposure.



Individual risk factors you should consider include whether you or someone you live with is at increased risk for severe illness, such as older adults and individuals with underlying medical conditions. Also, consider if you are diligent at practicing everyday preventive measures like handwashing, mask wearing and physical distancing, as doing so means you are better prepared when you choose to go out.

Hesitancy about going out is understandable and everyone should determine what kind of interactions and what level of risk they are comfortable with. If you do choose to venture out, always bring along a cloth face covering, tissues and hand sanitizer to be prepared for interaction in any setting.

# Two Pandemics...

**W**e are living during two pandemics—health and racism. Who knew just a few months ago that in 2020 our country would be almost entirely shut down because of the Coronavirus/COVID-19? One that would cause us to “shelter at home,” practice social distancing, wear face coverings and improve our hand sanitizing to flatten the curve to reduce the spread of the disease. We were further advised to only leave home if we were considered an essential worker or for those essentials.

Before we could completely phase back into some normalcy, we witnessed the shocking and needless death of George Floyd in Minnesota. As a result of his death, and recent others, the world went into massive protests for justice for Black people against police brutality. # Thank you to food workers who helped Serve 40,000 lunches during COVID-19 Pandemic

Brown Deer School District is committed to providing students with well-balanced meals throughout the school week. This commitment continued last March when schools closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. With the help of Aramark Food Service, the Brown Deer School District provided over 70,000 meals for students 18 and under from March to June 2020. Meals were provided



## GPS Graduation

The School District of Brown Deer has partnered with GPS Education Partners for the past eight years, and has graduated approximately twenty students. GPS has led the work-based learning initiative in Wisconsin for almost twenty years. In collaboration with businesses,

communities, and school districts GPSEd offers high school students a unique, innovative, educational model that prepares students to succeed in technical careers while promoting business viability.

Students who attend GPSEd are provided a work-based learning experience where education is aligned with on the job training. This program is made possible through partnerships with education, industry, nonprofit and for-profit organizations. This year, two Brown Deer School District students graduated from GPS Education Partners. The virtual graduation ceremony was held on June 9th and the Brown Deer students were celebrated by Dr. Deb Kerr, wishing them a final farewell.

## Virtual African-American Female Institute- Year 3

The Third Annual African-American Female Institute (AAFI) sponsoring the Closing the Achievement Gap Consortium (CAGC) was held June 23-26, 2020. One hundred high school girls representing 13 school districts participated in this virtual experience. Dr. Monica Kelsey-Brown, Coordinator and Rashonda Spencer, Director created a curriculum designed to provide information, workshops and seminars for girls to envision themselves as future leaders.

- Participation in a Board and Brush activity
- Keynote address by Judge Valarie Hill, Milwaukee Municipal Court,
- Black Lives Matter Session State Representative LaKeisha Myers
- Financial Literacy Session Jaquilla Ross, President of the National Association of Black Accountants (beginning with daily affirmations for everyone to center themselves and begin with a positive mindset. This virtual experience will enrich, empower, and enhance their ability to view themselves as future leaders in school and beyond).

## Pre-Apprenticeship Program Grants for Brown Deer High School

The Industry Advisory program is a capstone experience in the Construction program at Brown Deer High School (BDHS), that prepares young adults for a career in the skilled building trades. It is the only high school program in the state recognized by the WI Department of

Workforce Development (DWD), as a “Pre-Apprenticeship Readiness Program.” As such, BDHS qualified to apply for DWD funding to increase women and minority involvement in the building trades, and was one of two programs in the state to be awarded these funds. More details are still to come about this exciting award, which may allow for a new Pre-Apprentice Program Manager position at BDHS. The BDHS Technical Education staff is looking forward to working even closer with the WI DWD staff!

Additionally, BDHS was selected as a 2020 Schools to Skills Grant Recipient, which includes a \$13,000 grant from Home Building Institute (HBI), Home Depot Foundation and the National Housing Endowment to implement the HBI’s Pre-Apprenticeship Certificate Training (PACT) curriculum. PACT is developed by members of the housing industry and combines academic instruction and hands-on training on actual construction projects. The curriculum also provides literacy and employability skills. Future students receiving a PACT certificate will be recognized as a Pre-Apprentice by the US Department of Labor.

Students can be assured that whatever the class looks like for the 2020-2021 school year - in person or at home - the course will be supported by our local building industry. Building Advantage is prepared to fund a distance-learning set of projects by providing the materials to create home kits of pre-cut lumber, screws, and drills. Students will be able to build 5 different projects using the same lumber. No cutting, just fastening lumber according to printed specifications. The connection of classroom activities to industry partners is essential for students who want to pursue a career in the skilled trades!

## Virtual Summer School - A Success!

Virtual summer school was designed to engage students and continue the momentum created during the 2020-2021 school year. Classes focused on reading and math skills as well as enrichment activities. 2020 Summer School was accessible to Brown Deer students in a virtual format for current 4k students through 8th grade. Instruction was provided by Brown Deer teaching staff through Zoom, 220 students participated in pre-recorded lessons and supplemental activities to provide fun, hands-on learning experiences in an effort to prepare students for the next grade level.

## AM I REGISTERED TO VOTE?

Are you a new Wisconsin voter? Has your name and/or residential address changed since you last registered to vote? Have you not voted in the past four (4) years? If so, you are required to complete a voter registration application. Check your voter registration status at any time, by visiting [MyVote.WI.gov](https://www.MyVote.WI.gov)

- Voters must reside at their residence for 10 consecutive days prior to the election.
- Changes in apartment numbers, even if you reside in the same building, are considered a change of address and a new voter registration must be completed.
- Name changes require a new voter registration application.

Brown Deer residents have four options to register to vote:

- **Online** - Register to vote online at [MyVote.WI.gov](https://www.MyVote.WI.gov)
- **By Mail** - Send in a completed Voter Registration Application to the Clerk's Office, Village of Brown Deer, 4800 W. Green Brook Dr., Brown Deer, WI 53223 or drop it in the curbside cream colored drop-box located near the front entrance of Village Hall. You must include your proof of residence. Please note, the cut off for mailing in your registration to the Clerk's Office is 20 days before an election.
- **At Your Polling Location on Election Day** - Be sure to bring proof of residence and your photo ID.
- **In Person** - Register to vote at Village Hall, 4800 W. Green Brook Dr., Monday through Friday from 8:00 am-4:30 pm.

## DO I NEED PHOTO ID?

All Wisconsin voters must show an acceptable photo ID before voting. This includes voters at polling places and absentee voters. The address on your photo ID does NOT have to be your current address and the name on your ID does NOT need to be an exact match to your name in the poll book (such as an abbreviated name). Visit [BringIt.WI.gov](https://www.BringIt.WI.gov) for more information!

The following photo IDs are acceptable (as long as the ID did not expire before the last Fall General Election - November 6, 2018).

- Wisconsin Driver's License, even if revoked or suspended
- Wisconsin Identification Card issued by the DMV (available for free)
- A Military ID card issued by a U.S. uniformed service
- A U.S. Passport
- An identification card issued by a federally recognized Indian tribe in Wisconsin (can be used even if expired, regardless of expiration date)

## VOTE ABSENTEE

Under Wisconsin law, any voter who prefers to vote by absentee ballot may request one! If you are not already registered to vote, you must do so to request an absentee ballot.

Requests for an absentee ballot to be mailed can be made at any time! The sooner you do so for the next election, the better. The deadline to request a ballot by mail is the Thursday preceding each election at 5:00 pm.

Completed absentee ballots **MUST** be returned to the Clerk's Office no later than 8:00 pm on Election Day. Ballots may be returned via mail or dropped in the Village Hall drop-box.

You may request a ballot:

- **Online** - Apply at [MyVote.WI.gov](https://www.MyVote.WI.gov)
- **By Mail** - Send in a completed Absentee Ballot Application to the Clerk's Office, Village of Brown Deer, 4800 W. Green Brook Dr., Brown Deer, WI 53223 or drop it in the curbside cream colored drop-box located near the front entrance of Village Hall no later than Thursday October 29, 2020. Be sure to enclose a copy of your photo I.D.
- **In-Person** - All in-person absentee voting takes place at Brown Deer Village Hall. Visit the Village website at [www.browndeerwi.org](http://www.browndeerwi.org) or contact the Village Clerk's office at (414) 371-3050 or via email at [jkf@browndeerwi.org](mailto:jkf@browndeerwi.org) for dates and times.

If you elect to vote absentee in-person at the Clerk's office, you will be asked to show your photo I.D. and state your full name and address out loud.

## WHAT'S ON MY BALLOT?

Sample ballots are typically available 47 days before an election with federal contests and 21 days before state and local contests.





The Department Offices of the Director and Supervisor are in the new DPW building. Programming registrations and permits for the Village Park Shelters and the Lois and Tom Dolan Community Center will still be accepted at the front desk at Village Hall. **Village Hall, 4800 W. Green Brook Drive is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.**

## Fees and Refunds Policy

**Insurance** The Park and Recreation Department does not provide hospital or medical insurance coverage for individuals who participate in sponsored programs. Participants are advised to obtain their own insurance coverage prior to registration in any program.

**Physician Referral** Participants who are over 40 years of age or who have health problems are advised to consult a physician prior to registration in adult fitness classes.

**Photographs** For program promotion purposes, photographs may be taken of participants during a program. If you do not want your or your child's photograph taken, please advise the class instructor.

**Child Care** Child care is not provided for adult programs. Children are not permitted to attend adult programs without supervision of another adult who is not actively participating in the activity.

**Program Confirmations** Confirmations will not be sent. Assume you are enrolled and plan to attend unless otherwise notified.

**Waiting Lists** The Park and Recreation Department will make every effort to accommodate individuals on waiting lists. If an opening becomes available, you will be contacted by telephone.

The trail carries you down to beautiful Lake Michigan and its beaches, all adding up to a great ride.

The **Ozaukee Interurban Trail** is a 32-mile path through the communities of Mequon, Thiensville, Cedarburg, Grafton, Port Washington, Belgium and Cedar Grove. This trail route connects historic downtowns with natural landscapes. Views along the Trail include woodlands, wetlands, farmlands, Cedar Creek, the Milwaukee River and Lake Michigan – and is designated as a hotspot for birding. ## Our Second Call to Action

May 2020. Black lives matter. We stand with our students, our staff, and families and strive to build up all of our children to advocate and speak their truth no matter



the color of their skin. People of color speaking their truth can no longer be viewed as disorderly, disrespectful, or disruptive. No longer can their truth be dismissed, disregarded, or devalued. We are living in the year of the COVID-19 pandemic and again dealing with the senseless deaths of African

Americans across the United States. The first months of 2020 have become the most divisive in our history. As leaders of the most diverse school district in our region and state, we take responsibility for educating ourselves and others about the structures that perpetuate racism and oppression. We work together to change racist educational practices. Learning is part of our call to action as educators. With the recent events of police brutality, fear is running deep in many communities, protests are prevalent, and people are speaking out. We are heartbroken and devastated when we watch these repeated inequities that continue to leave lasting and painful memories for our children, our families, and our community. This trauma impacts our children, families, staff and all members of our school community.

Our Village of Brown Deer also took action. Village President Wanda Montgomery presented a proclamation to address racial inequities in our community. Here is a section of the proclamation read out loud by her at the Village Board meeting:



*"The Brown Deer community is not immune from these types of issues happening here. So, we hold in our thoughts and lift up in our prayers, all those hurting in our country as a result of these great losses. Although we have not had the experience that some other communities have had, we want our community to know that we are a community that supports all of our residents. We work*

*with all of our citizens to make sure they have equal access to all of our services and are treated with respect and integrity by the village staff and board. Dr. Martin Luther King stated "Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly affects all indirectly. We proclaim that we will be one Brown Deer. We are a community that embraces all, regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, religion, sexual orientation, mental/physical ability or socio-economic status. We further proclaim that we will continue to work diligently to bring all of Brown Deer together and support a community in which we can all be proud."*

The Brown Deer Village Trustees passed this proclamation unanimously. We will leverage our privilege to advocate on behalf of students and families. Our school district represents the real world with over 80% students of color and rising poverty over 50%. We support our children and families who have been subjected to these

tragedies and who live with the fear and pain of racism every day. We will be intentional as we put this learning into action. We are in the process of re-evaluating how we teach and what we teach for deeper learning to attain better engagement for all students and staff. We have been planning for re-entry and recovery since April as we know we will not have another chance to get this right.

### Listen, Reflect, and Learn

We call on you to unite and not divide: work together- engage in courageous conversations rather than being silent and complicit. We call on you to see our diversity as strength for collective change. We call on you to interrupt systems of oppression and instead advance the cause of human dignity and social justice. It is never too late to speak up and speak out. The time is now. We call on you to recognize the systemic racism that has historically occurred in our country. The deep-rooted systemic racism continues to wound communities of color and impacts every one of us. Eradication of racism and marginalization is the work of every community, just like it's the responsibility of every community to eliminate achievement gaps. As a district we will continue working from our Brown Deer Way virtues of character, focusing on the whole child, growth mindset, rigorous learning expectations, and developing nurturing relationships with our young people. We approach our students and staff as a family. We will work from a place of care and love for the whole child and whole staff member. This requires us to listen more than we speak and ask our families what we can do to support. We model acceptance of all throughout outreach and communication. We are not perfect and don't always get things right, however, we continue to provide access and opportunity to all of our children as equity is at the heart of all that we do. To support our call to action, there are resources on our website that provide



information to better understand racism and equity. Together, we will learn and reflect upon the conversations that are essential to move our school district and community forward. Watch for more details about future programming.

**Actions Speak Louder than Words**

The School District of Brown Deer is proud to be one of the most diverse school districts in the state of Wisconsin.

Families move to Brown Deer to be an integral part of a vibrant community that accepts people for who they are, celebrates diversity, and welcomes multiple perspectives. We are an All-America City. The program was fabulous with guest speakers, artistic opportunities for the children, and an opportunity to meet others from our community.

As Martin Luther King said, “Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about the things that matter.” We are a community and people of action. Together, we will find a way. It’s the Brown Deer Way!
